Welcome - Jean Delcher welcomed everyone to the to the meeting and introduced the distinguished guests who were present.

Officer's Reports

Approval of Minutes - Gwen Crisafulli requested approval of the minutes from the General Luncheon at April 24th at the Ocean City Golf Club. Mary Adair so moved. Hedy Cronin seconded. MCU (Motion Carried Unanimously).

Treasurer/Budget - Jane Wolnik presented a detailed report of the group's financial status.

Asst. Treasurer/ Membership - Jennie Allen informed the group that as of today we have 22 new members, and 117 renewals for a total of 139 active members which is 91% of last year. We also have 3 new associate members and 15 renewals for a total of 15 associate members. Right now, we are the largest club in the MFRW. Jennie introduced the guests and new members who were present. Jennie then thanked the members who volunteered at the Ocean Pines Kickoff Saturday, it was a huge success. She also encouraged the members to invite Republican and Libertarian men and women they know who are not members to attend the luncheons.

Mary Adair - Parliamentarian -RWWC nominating committee - Mary introduced the nominating committee. The nominating committee will be looking for people to volunteer to be on the Board. Jean added that we are in need of people who are computer savvy to help with emails and newsletters.

Announcements-

Thanks to Raye Simpson we are again receiving a highest award from MFRW again this year.

Jean Delcher spoke about the money that has been donated to the recent floods and wildfires. Today we will be making a donation to Skills USA. The club will be donating \$2200. Of that \$1500 will be directly from the club with the rest coming from member donations.

June 14th is Flag Day. We will be joining the Wicomico County Republican Women at Sherwood Williamson Rt 50 from 10-12 for flag waving.

There is Red, White and Blue jewelry available at the back table for purchase.

Linda Sears and her husband will be matching the \$500 donation for Believe in Tomorrow.

Introduction of Speaker - Jean Delcher for Carol Frazier. Mr. Softy from Fair US was unable to make it. But we have obtained three speakers for the meeting. Phil Cropper from Worcester Tech, Rick Stevens from Skills USA and Sheriff Matt Crisafulli from the Sheriff's office.

Phil Cropper began by thanking the Republican Women for their support of Worcester Tech. He then spoke about the Pines Cafe and the history of it. The Pines Cafe was started by an idea he had while he was at his doctor's appointment. He saw a space available and jumped right in to make his idea a reality. It required a lot of time and hard work. He now has two managers and two students that run the cafe under his supervision. He currently has six youth apprentices and has been recently approved for a new program that will have senior apprentices who will oversee the new apprentices. The cafe is open from 7:30-4:00, Monday through Friday. They also have

home meals available. Go to the Pines Cafe on Facebook for the menu. Items can also be orders at Thepinescafe.com.

Rick Stevens currently teaches welding at Worcester Tech. He is a SkillsUSA advisor for the school. Skills USA is a national student organization which competes in contests. 842 students have been able to join without any out-of-pocket expenses. This is a club with officers and there is a conference each November at the Carousel Hotel for the students to learn how to be an officer. The local competitions are in February. The winners will then go on to the Regional competition and then the State competition. This year it cost \$25,000 to attend the State competition. In June the winners of the State competitions will be going to Atlanta to compete with other students from across the country. Thirty of our students will be attending at a cost of \$94,000. Rick Stevens was then presented with a check for \$2241 that is being donated from the club (\$1500) and its members.

Sheriff Matt Crisafulli then spoke to the group about recent scams in the area. He gave the member examples of people who had been taken advantage of and gave tips on ways to not become a victim. He also informed the group about some of the tactics being used. Two important tips are not to clip on links and call offices or organization directly to verify information.
