Opening Ceremonies

Sandy Zitzer, President – 11:10 AM
Jan Kolesky, Chaplain, offered an Opening Prayer
Amy Mike – Sgt. At Arms
Sandy Zitzer, president, welcomed everyone who was present (83 attendees) and introduced elected officials and candidates who were present. She reminded everyone about Early Voting for the primary that will take place at Worcester Preparatory School in Berlin (as of now). Sandy shared that next month's Annual Red, White & Blue general meeting will take place at Byrd Park in Snow Hill. The event will be catered by Jim Washington.
Amy Mike requested approval of the minutes for the April 28, 2022 meeting. Jan Kolesky so moved. Theresa Denshuick seconded.
On behalf of Jean Delcher, Mary Adair gave a report on our financial status.
Mary Adair reported that we currently have 138 regular members including 5 new members. 99 members renewed and we've added 39 new members.
Theresa Denshuick has sent out 11 Welcome Letters to new members of the club since our last meeting.
Merilee Horvat thanked everyone for a fantastic Candidate Forum held on May 11, 2022. She then shared highlights of the upcoming "FUN Raiser" with the Fashion Show to be held on September 22, 2022 at The Grand Hotel. We need everyone to support this event as we have 38 tables of 8 to fill. The deadline to register is September 10, 2022. Forms were distributed for people to step up and become a table CAPTAIN to process registrations for their table. She also requested all members to actively solicit gift cards, donations and wine to be used for the "Surprise Box" sales at the event.
Liz Mumford introduced guest attendee, Patrick Kerr who is the incoming president of the Salisbury University <i>Young Republicans Club</i> . She then went into the main reason for today's gathering – to hear from the Republican Gubernatorial Candidates for Maryland. Before doing so she reminded everyone that RWWC does NOT endorse any candidate BEFORE the primary election. She shared that each candidate, or their representative, would be allotted 10 to 12 minutes to speak – in alphabetical order.

Speakers

Dan Cox from Frederick County presented himself as being the only one endorsed by Trump and he believes in America First Values. He stressed that whoever is in charge needs to follow the Constitution. He believes that indoctrination has to end. We need to embrace Family Values and end indoctrination of children in regard to CRT and gender/sexual indoctrination. He helped to kill the abortion amendment and the infanticide bill. Even though the liberals did get through funding for abortion, he will strip the funding if elected.

tl sj p F	Robin Ficker from Montgomery County has been a constant figure on the Ocean City Boardwalk he last few summers. He is the ONLY candidate who wants to cut sales tax by 2 cents. He has sponsored 25 measures. His main emphasis has been and will continue to be term limits, limiting property tax to the rate of inflation, no tax increases, bring jobs to Maryland through the Jobs Strike Force and wake up the MD Department of Commerce since every major US company has shunned Maryland in recent years.

She presented Kelly's goal to build on the successes during the Hogan years.
