

Introduction of Main Speaker – In a change of usual procedures of doing business first, Sandy Zitzer introduced the main speaker, Loren Spivack, "The Free Market Warrior" to the group. Mr. Spivack proceeded to share his insights into American politics and Economics. Several key points include:

- It's important to understand the "modern left." They have no PRINCIPLES that apply to everybody all the time. They spout their BELIEFS. The LEFT is a cult of power who want absolute control over everybody's lives.
- At stake right now is Freedom of Speech, the Justice System, and Capitalism (vs. Socialism).
- Loren shared some of the books he has written and had available for purchase by members. These are parodies of some of Dr. Seuss's books, including: *The New Democrat*, *The Glorax, The Wizard of Iz, and Kamelot* (a satire on the Biden Administration).

Meeting: Officer's Reports

- President Sandy Zitzer welcomed everyone and introduced elected officials who were present. She congratulated everyone on making the Fashion Show in September a HUGE success. She shared some of what took place at the NFRW National Convention she recently attended. The biggest take-away was the resolution passed that "ONLY naturally born women" can be members of any group of Republican Women. We will go along with whatever is decided on the state level. She encouraged everyone to sign a petition currently being circulated to OPPOSE the changes being made to Title IX. Sandy invited Raye Simpson and Mary Adair to come forward for presentation of recent honors the club had earned through their hard work. We were awarded the DIAMOND ACHIEVEMENT AWARD at the NFRW Convention for the Awards presentation Raye submitted to them. At the recent MFRW Convention we received the Membership Award for having the largest group in the state, thanks to the hard work Mary put in. Sandy also recognized Carol Frazier for receiving the Volunteer Award for her work with the Worcester Youth and Family Services.
- Recording Secretary Amy Mike requested the approval of the minutes from the last General Business Meeting held on June 22, 2023. Kathie Thompson so moved. Mary Adair seconded. Motion

Carried Unanimously (MCU).

- Treasurer Jean Delcher presented details regarding the profits from our recent Fashion Show hich with 308 people attending resulted in a profit of over \$11,000. She shared our current financial status with the group. Jean then asked for a motion to approve the BUDGET for 2024 which had been published to the membership a month ago as required. Mary Adair so moved. Joanne Kirby seconded. MCU.
- Membership Mary Adair welcomed four new members who were present at the meeting and shared that she was in the market for everyone to renew their membership. We currently have 149 active members, 30 of whom have just joined this year.
- 1ST Vice President Sandy Zitzer reported for Liz Mumford that our dinner meeting on November will be held at the Atlantic Hotel but pointed out that there is limited seating at this venue. The speaker will be Congressman Andy Harris.
- 2ND Vice President Merilee Horvat began by inviting people to get onboard and join the Fashion Show Committee for next year's event. She brought with her packets with raffle tickets for the Valentine Raffle and asked everyone to pick theirs up before leaving the meeting.
