#### Legislative Committee Report

There are a couple of hot topics regarding legislation that are updated below:

- MARYLAND GUN SAFETY ACT Part of the Maryland Gun Safety Act of 2023 has been blocked due to a lawsuit in federal court. The new law required gun owners to receive consent of certain business owners to carry their guns into those businesses. The restriction on carrying into bars, restaurants, demonstrations, and private property are NOT effective during the pendency of this challenge. - GAS TAX a newly formed 31-member (only 1 Republican) Commission on Transportation Revenue and Infrastructure Needs has been formed to find alternative sources of funding transportation projects. A suggestion has been made to move away from a gas tax to a surcharge on miles driven, which would obviously require tracking devices on vehicles. 
#### Worcester County Commission for Women -- Annual Gems Tea 2023
