Welcome Sandy Zitzer, president, welcomed everyone and introduced elected officials who were present.

Special recognition was given to our own Senator Mary Beth Carozza and guests from the NFRW and MFRW including: NFRW 1st Vice President, Vanessa LaFranco our guest speaker, NFRW Region 7 Director (our region), Monica Koslowsky, NFRW Recording Secretary, Lilliana Norkaitis, President of the MFRW, Sharon Carrick, and MFRW 4th Vice President, Maria Sophia. Also attending this meeting was Marilyn Booker, President of the Sussex County Republican Women's Club. Sandy then invited members to introduce any guests accompanying

them.

Officer's Reports

Recording Secretary Amy Mike requested the approval of the minutes from the last General Business Meeting held

Committee Updates

State Senator Senator Mary Beth Carozza addressed the group. She thanked the national and state Republican

Women leaders for their presence. Mary Beth is the ONLY state female senator. She challenged the group to double-down and get organized for the upcoming national elections. She encouraged

us to take advantage by getting involved on all levels.

<u>Introduction of Speaker</u> Liz Mumford, 1st Vice President, introduced several guest speakers.

First up was Monica Kozlowsky, NFRW Region 7 Director (which includes Maryland), who has been nominated for the 1st Vice President for NFRW at the upcoming National Convention to be held in Oklahoma City. Monica encouraged everyone to attend the convention.

Next up was Sharon Carrick, President of MFRW. Sharon shared that MFRW will reimburse HALF of the registration fee to attend the convention – AFTER proof of actual attendance is presented.
