I have been abundantly blessed by Pathways in my 4 years in Elkhart and I am excited for you all to have the opportunity to be part of their ministry as well.

Throughout the coming months, I hope you participate in the council work and the work of Pathways, because we need to have everybody's voice from the most senior of members to the young people as well. We all can contribute to this process and Augustana is a better place when all are working together. There may be rough moments and disagreements, but we trust that God is present in those places as well. The most important step for all of us is to continue to hold this in prayer.

Please continue to use me as a resource and let me know what questions you have about this process. I want to help and be a good partner in your discernment, while also having this be your process. May you know that God is with you in this time of transition and in all the times of our lives. Lean on that presence, lean on this community of faith, and know that God is always doing something new in our midst.

Where God is doing new things

When it grew late, his disciples came to Jesus and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now very late; send the crowd away so that they may go into the surrounding country and villages and buy something for themselves to eat." But he answered them, "You give them something to eat." They said to him, "Are we to go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread, and give it to them to eat?" And he said to them, "How many loaves have you? Go and see." When they had found out, they said, "Five, and two fish" … Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to his disciples to set before the people…And all ate and were filled. [Mark 6:37-44]

When the first followers of Jesus see people who were hungry, their immediate instinct was to tell the crowd to run to the nearest McDonalds® and feed themselves. Before they can shoo the crowd away, however, Jesus simply says to them, "You give them something to eat." The disciples protest. What?! Are we supposed to spend our own money to purchase hundreds of loaves of bread to feed thousands of hungry people? We don't have that much money! Another simple response from Jesus, a question that points beyond their protest and turns their attention in another direction: "How many loaves do you have? Go and see."

Those early disciples are us. When faced with significant need of almost any sort, even (and maybe especially) when we sense Jesus calling us to do something about it, our inclination is to immediately assume and assert that we don't have what it would take to address the need. It happens in our personal lives and it happens in our life together as communities of faith. Pause for just a moment to think about the last time in the face of some discovered need you heard someone say, heard yourself say, or remembering thinking, something like, "I/We don't have the money, people, youth, time, energy, needed to address that."

More often than not, our eyes glaze over in a fixed stare into what we don't have, we are paralyzed, do nothing, and we find ourselves muttering all sorts of reasons why we can't act on Jesus' command, to "give them something to eat."

Thankfully, through stories like this one the ancient writer Mark tells, occasionally Jesus reaches out to jar us out of our stupor by turning our attention in a different direction and encouraging us to do an inventory of what we see: "So, what <u>do</u> you have? Go and see."

What do you suppose would happen if every time we were faced with some need and sensed the Spirit calling us to do something about it – to "give them something to eat" – rather than first assuming and asserting that we don't have what we need to follow that call, we, instead, assumed and asserted that God has already given us what we need in order to do what God is calling us to do and then went looking for it? Of course, we don't assume that we have *everything* needed (life is rarely an all or nothing proposition). Rather, we trust that God has given us *something* and that at least part of that something might be relationships with or proximity to others who also have something to contribute.

Here's the amazing thing about all this: When we have done the inventory that God has given us – what we do have – we can offer it to Jesus (alongside what others offer him) and, as with the five loaves and two fish that our ancestors in faith discovered in that deserted place centuries ago, Jesus promises to bless it, break it, and give it back to us to share with others trusting that God will add what others offer and multiply it so all will eat and be filled.


What do you have? Go and see. Bring it to Jesus, who will bless it and break it, give it back, and multiply it in the sharing of it.

Pastor Dan opened with prayer.

Minutes from the June Council Meeting- John Metz asked if there were any questions or concerns on the minutes. Brad Ganczak moved to accept the minutes, Deb Rowland seconded. A unanimous vote carried.

Pledge/Giving report- John Metz asked if there were any questions or concerns on the report. Kathy Nowak noted that the Special Funds Drive has been paid off, also that the amount donated to the general fund was skewed because money from the interest of the Paul Fishbaugh Fund had been deposited in anticipation of cost for replacing the roof over the choir robe room, and the flooring in that room. AJ Diller moved to accept the report, Brad Ganczak seconded. A unanimous vote carried.

Treasurer's report- John Metz asked if there were any questions or concerns on the Treasurer's report. The question came up that since the Special Funds loan is paid off how soon that money will be paid back to the Parsonage Fund. Doris Koontz asked about the new roof and if the \$9,000+ that was put in the General Fund from the Fishbaugh Fund would be able to be moved back soon since the insurance company had sent a check to cover it. Brad Ganczak updated everyone on the status of the roof and flooring in the choir robe room. Deb Rowland moved to accept both Pledge/Giving and Treasurer reports, Janet Ermis seconded. A unanimous vote carried.

Pastor's report-

• Pastor Dan gave a report out that included Recently Accomplished items, Wildly Important Goals, and Questions/Concerns for the Council in areas of Praise (Worship Related Ministries), Grow (Christian Education, Confirmations, etc.), Serve (Mission and Service opportunities), Share (Stewardship, Property, Financial), Pastoral Care (specifically Augustana), Congregational Council, Redeemer Conversations, Grace Conversations, Wider Church Expression, Continuing Education, and Personal. This gave the council a snapshot of what Pastor Dan has accomplished in church worship and growth, the conversations and concerns that grow out from the three Lutheran churches in Elkhart, and where Pastor Dan is in his personal and professional growth over the past month.

Pastor Dan shared that Grace would be having their annual congregational meeting on October 21. Council members asked further questions about the fate of Redeemer, and Pastor Dan explained that Grace had agreed to work with them to acquire/merge Redeemer. That the synod will be working with Grace to set up an ethnic specific ministry in that building.

Parish Education Committee — Heidi Scupham spoke about the Sunday School and reported that they expect to start the new school year on September 9th. Diane Erickson spoke about the new tutoring season, she reported that it will be done at the school instead of at the church because the school had offered them room there.

Worship & Music Committee — AJ Diller reported that they have a meeting scheduled for next week.

Social Ministry & Evangelism Committee – Diane Erickson spoke about an Elvis Trivia Night/Boys Lock-In they were planning for October.

Endowment Committee – Brenda Miller reported Scholarships had been sent out for the Fall semester.

Memorial Committee — Janet Ermis noted that there was nothing new to report at this time. **Property Committee** — Brad Ganczak reported that he had made repairs to the drainage in the parking lot.

Old Business:

*Pastor of Record renewal options were discussed. Janet Ermis motioned to extend the current Pastor of Record agreement until December 31, 2018, and Doris Koontz seconded. A unanimous vote carried.

New Business:

*The floor was open for council and guests to discuss the matter of Augustana moving forward and what that involved. After much discussion it was decided that because of a feeling that the full congregation was not on the same page with what direction Augustana should go since Pastor Steve has retired, the council felt it was important that a full congregational meeting should be held after the all ready scheduled small group meeting on August 26. Kathy Nowak gathered the points that should be brought up in the announcement of the meeting. Also, Pastor Dan offered to reach out to Heather Apel at the synod office for her to come to a council meeting to help members with any questions and give insights.

*Kathy Nowak noted, for informational purposes, that the tax sale on property on 2nd and Redding should be happening before the end of the year; that Sparkhouse Sunday School program was coming up for renewal; and reported that Pastor Steve had given her the cash from the Good Samaritan Fund account with instruction to find out what the council wanted done with it. Janet moved to donate it to the Monday Night Meals, Deb Rowland seconded, and A unanimous vote carried.

Janet Ermis motioned to adjourn, Brad Ganczak seconded. A unanimous in favor carried.

Pastor Dan closed with devotions.
