Dear Friends in Christ,

As I write this to you, Reformation Sunday is in the rear-view mirror, next Sunday is All Saints' Sunday with the time change, and then we are looking straight ahead to the Last Sunday of the church year (November 24th – Christ the King Sunday, Thanksgiving, Advent, and Christmas), to say nothing about it being a general election for our country this year.

We all know what these next two months mean stress, stress, and more stress. It has been reported that November and December are the two most stressful months of the year. Now I am not saying that any of these individual holidays or holy days are in and of themselves stressful...put them all together and they still wouldn't produce the kind of stress which most of us experience. Thanksgiving and Christmas provide us events with family and friends which cause us to pause and be thankful for our many blessings and share those blessings with others while at the same time they provide us opportunities to celebrate the mystery and miracle of the birth of our Savior, Jesus. You would think that these two months would bring us feelings of joy, peace, and hope. Isn't that what most of our Christmas greetings say? But all the stuff surrounding these months causes us to fret, become angry, impatient, cranky, and in some instances, we find ourselves becoming down right insensitive and nasty. My guess is that you can identify with at least some of the above. Everyone's stress is different and for different reasons which may include both negative and positive things, events, or people. We know that our stress can cause physical responses such as elevated heart rate, blood pressure, pain...emotional responses such as racing thoughts, mood swings, depression, anxiety, fears...and spiritual responses such as changes in belief, inability to pray, separating one's self from the faith community, not receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion out of feelings of unworthiness, or being so overwhelmed that scripture is too difficult to read, meditate, or reflect upon. None of these physical, emotional, or spiritual responses are what God could possibly want for his children whom he loved so much that he gave his life to save us eternally. So, what can we possibly do to prepare ourselves in order that we might find deep joy and positive experiences over these next eight weeks?

First, we must prioritize what we will do and how we will do it, identifying for ourselves that we are not able to do everything, and we cannot be all that everyone may expect of us. We need to look at this November/December cycle of days in the context of our whole life and the lives of our family. What are the challenges and struggles which we already bring with us into the holidays asking God to help us see each experience and individual who seems to stress us as a forgiven/loved child of God made in God's image. We are not the only person who is feeling stressed; others are probably feeling similar stress. We are after all human with a desire to appear in control while at the same time hoping others will love us, like us, and even approve of us. As a *(Continued on Page 2)*

Christian we sometimes misunderstand religion as having a 24/7 happy face and believing that everything should be ok because "God is good;" but Jesus said he didn't come to "fix the challenges and stresses" in our lives, but rather to offer us abundant life in the midst of it all. Christ's life was anything but stress free and yet, He is the one who offers us His yoke is easy and burden light. Matthew 11:28-30 says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble of heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

Stress is part of life; and so just like every other part of life, we as Christian Lutherans must respond to it in a different way from the world. Rather than let the stress of the next two months rob you of the peace, joy, and hope of the season, let it give us the opportunity to elevate Jesus and all the Jesus tools which we have been given: Ask yourself each day and in preparing to participate in each event if this is in line with God's priorities and perspectives. Survey what you are allowing in your life: what are you watching, listening to, and reading? When we edit some things out of our life that will allow more time for other things, like being in scripture which can help us handle the stresses of life better. If you, like me, are not very good at taking an intentional 24-hour Sabbath each week, this would be the time to do it. We all have more productive days, better sleep, and more positive mood when we are intentionally keeping the Sabbath. I pray that your holy days and holidays will be stress free; but if not, be kind and loving to yourself and others.

What do you want? Do you know? Why does it matter anyway? Making Decisions before the End-of-Life

My guess is that in some way each of us has started early on in our lives planning for retirement. But I can tell you after providing pastoral care for dozens of individuals and families just at Augustana and Grace alone, most people have not even started to think of end of life issues...not even when they are in the 70's, 80's, and 90's.

Ask yourself right now if you have a Will. (Who will be your executor of your property, belongings, and financial wealth no matter how small it might be?) Have you designated where memorials should go...your church, outreach program, etc.? Have you signed a Living Will? (This is a medical document dealing with artificially supplied nutrition and hydration.) Have you named a Health Care Power of Attorney? (If you are unable to speak or think for yourself, your HCPOA would make the decisions that are important to you. This need not be a family member but should be someone you trust.) Have you talked with a Doctor about an Out of Hospital DNR or POST document? (If you are at home and your heart stops, do you want CPR and to be put on life support? If this document is in a lock box at the bank, that will not help you.)

There are other important documents and decisions which need to be considered. Have you filled out the paperwork we have at the church which helps you determine what kind of service you want? What hymns and scripture would you want used? Do you want visitation with casket (open or closed), cremation, or cremation following a visitation with a casket? Do you want a service at church, at a funeral home, graveside only, memorial, or celebration of life someplace else?

Have you been to a funeral home or cremation services to make arrangements? Have you chosen your casket? Do you have a cemetery plot or a spot in a mausoleum which is pre-paid? Have you written your obituary? Sister Nora can give you the paperwork for that as well.

These are all things we can spare our families trying to figure out after our death. They will already be grieving; and if we can spare them more grief, shouldn't we do that?

The point is that each of us needs to be responsible for our end-of-life decisions as much as we have been for our day-to-day existence or our retirement planning. These are not just ethical or moral responsibilities, but they are spiritual issues which touch the very depth of our being.

<u>Newsletter Facebook & Website Postings</u> -The decision was made to remove all personal contact information on our Facebook page and our Website to protect privacy.



November 1st - All Saints' Day

Observed on Sunday, November 3rd at 11:00 AM

On all Saint's Sunday we remember by name all who have died in our congregation during the last year; but we also remember all dear to us who have died in past years. Their names will be read, a candle lit and a bell will toll. We set aside a remembrance table where photographs, newspaper clippings or other mementos of our dear ones are displayed so that all may recall their life and honor their memory. As we remember our blessed dead and all who have gone before us, we contemplate the enormity of Christ's body with those of every time and every place – the whole company of the Saints – all who have been baptized into Christ's death. As Lutherans we know that all saints are sinners and every sinner is a saint. You have heard me say it many times before "simul Justus et peccator"...At the same time both saint and sinner. We especially remember that it is God's grace, not our good works, that



make us a saint. On this Day of ALL Saints we proclaim a mystery which we proclaim every Sunday during the Eucharist: "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." We celebrate All Saints' Day on November 1st when much of the North American landscape appears to be dying. Days are shorter, trees are becoming bare as they lose their last leaves, and the sun is sinking lower in the sky with each new day. As we trace the cross on our foreheads or over our body we recall the one whose death and resurrection has formed this company of all the saints, hallowing all our lives. On Sunday, November ^{3rd}, we reimagine the world. Even in death, God makes all things new. These are the saints who have died in the faith since last All Saints' Day:
