

Ding! Ding!

This is the ding that says, *time's up!* It's the ding that shouts, *it's done!* and lets us know that the delicious smell coming from the oven is ready. It's the ding that surprises us, reminds us of something important, or brings a warning. *Ding ding ding!*

I hope you get familiar with this *ding* over the next month because you will hear a bell ring in worship in a special way this Advent season. Each week during the children's message, I will invite the kids to ring a bell—*ding!*—and share a time when they suddenly noticed God at work in their life. Kids are so good at connecting what they learn at church with the rest of the world. I am confident they will have plenty to *ding* about! But maybe I'll have to give the adults a chance to ring the bell too...

Because this is an important skill we are cultivating together. When we train ourselves to notice how God shows up not just on Sunday morning, during bible study, or when we're volunteering at church, but also in our regular, ordinary, everyday lives in the world, *Emmanuel* is real. Near the beginning of the Gospel of Matthew, the author quotes Isaiah and tells us that when Jesus is born, "they shall name him Emmanuel, which means, 'God is with us.'" (Matthew 1:23) At the end of the Gospel of Matthew, as Jesus ascends and leaves his disciples, his final words are, "And remember, I am with you always..." (Matthew 28:20)

So when we sing "Emmanuel" in this Advent season, it is more than another name for Jesus. It is proclamation and promise to the world. At Christmas, God will be born among us again. And God will never leave us. This is at the heart of what it means to live as God's people now. The baby born and placed in a manger in Bethlehem as Emmanuel wasn't the end of the story—it was the beginning!

The love that you feel for those who matter to you most and the pain you feel when you miss them. *Ding!* The care of a stranger, no matter how small. *Ding!* The gift of forgiveness when someone has hurt you. *Ding!* The drive you feel to help and advocate for our neighbors in need. *Ding!* The way a radiant sunset, snowy day, or beautiful music fills your heart. *Ding!* The gratefulness you feel when you sit down before a simple meal. *Ding! Ding! Ding!*

The birth of Jesus means that God is present in our human existence in an entirely new way. *Ding!* And the work of the Holy Spirit means that the Divine power of Love Incarnate that entered our world through that little baby will never, ever leave us.

So on Christmas Eve, we'll ring all the bells as each of us finds our place around the manger. And I mean ALL the bells! Bring any and all bells you might own with you for worship on Christmas Eve. With our ringing, our singing, our living we will together testify to the birth of Jesus in the stable at Christmas, and in our lives each and every day.

Ding! Ding! ...and Merry Christmas!

Out of the Blue devotional reflections: Our Advent devotional started early this year, and many of you have been following along! Send us photos of your "found object" Jesse Tree or check out social media to see what others have done. It's not too late to pick up a copy and follow along for the entire Advent and Christmas season. Here's what's coming up...

Week of November 23: Unexpected Alliances—The Story of Rahab Read: Joshua 2:1-24, 6:24-25. Consider: What unexpected alliances in our lives can lead us deeper into God's story? Find: Something you use to welcome others, like a candle you light at the dinner table when there are guests, a pan you use for baking a favorite dish, or your good linens. Place it near your Jesse tree.

Week of November 30: Come What May—The Story of Ruth Read: Ruth 1:1-18. Consider: When has the love of someone beyond your biological family made a difference in your life? Find: Something that you would take on a trip, like an atlas, snacks, camping equipment, or a spare tire. Place it near your Jesse tree.

Week of December 7: Brokenness Reclaimed-The Story of Bathsheba

Read: 2 Samuel 11:2-27a. Consider: When has God taken a catastrophe in your life and found a way to bless you? Find: Something broken you still care about, like a piece of jewelry waiting for repair, a beloved stuffed animal with a rip, a favorite sweater beginning to unravel. Place it near your Jesse tree.

Week of December 14: Silence Speaks—The Story of Elizabeth and Zechariah Read: Luke 1:57-80. Consider: How can we learn, share, and identify God's work with those older or younger than ourselves? Find: Something you're willing to speak up for, like a branch from nature, a photo of people you care about, or a news article about a cause important to

you. Place it near your Jesse tree.

Week of December 21: A New Song—The Story of Mary Read: Luke 1:46-55. Consider: Where do you see the themes of Mary's Magnificat in Jesus' life and teaching? In your own life? Find: Something that sparks joy for you, even in the midst of hard times, like a program from a special event, a memento from a special occasion, a photo of a person who brings you joy, or your baptismal candle. Place it near your Jesse tree.

Christmas, December 25: Growing in God Read: Luke 2:1-20. Consider: Which stories have captured your attention this Advent? How might you carry their lessons beyond Christmas into a new season? Find: Something that points to new life or a baby, like a toy or baby item, a flower or bud, a new greeting from an old friend. Place it near your Jesse tree. Leave your tree up for the 12 days of Christmas, until Epiphany on January 6. Take time to look back on what you've added. What do these items say about your history? Can they plot a course through your journey of faith this season?
