

Dear Friends in Christ,

The daylight is growing shorter and the nights are lengthening. The leaves are just about through their yearly show and it's getting colder. Outside, the season is changing. As it does, we prepare for a change of seasons inside our churches too. Ready or not, Advent is coming!

The weeks leading up to Advent (which begins on November 30 this year) are always marked by growing darkness, and the themes we consider in worship on Sunday mornings will be somewhat dark too. We will hear about the end times and frightening prophesies. Scripture will point us to topics like change, mortality, and suffering. Sometimes the growing darkness outside is met by a lightness we feel at the impending holiday season, but sometimes it is met by darkness inside of us too. Festivities may remind us of those who aren't with us this year, or the financial burdens that can come with celebration, or the depressed mood that finds us when there is less sunshine.

Whether the changing season puts you in a festive mood or a dreary one, you are not alone. One thing is certain. Wherever we find ourselves, God will arrive. God will arrive in places, people, and ways that surprise us. Ways that we are totally unprepared for. God will arrive *out of the blue*.

This is the series we'll explore this Advent: *Out of the Blue*. Through scripture, song, prayer, and home devotionals, we will be reminded of God's incredible, surprising, unavoidable arrival: in the infant Jesus in the manger, at the end of all time in Christ's second coming, and daily in our lives. We will be reminded that no matter how little-prepared *we* are, *God* has been preparing for a long time. God has been laboring, waiting, planning, and working throughout the entire history of creation to arrive at just the right moment.

We'll fully launch into *Out of the Blue* in worship on the first Sunday of Advent, but our take-home devotional for the season begins soon—November 9! (Pick up yours at church beginning November 2.) You can expect to hear themes of surprise in our scripture and preaching all throughout the months of November and December. God will arrive amidst brokenness, in small subtle ways, in the in between, and all of a sudden. As we hear about these arrivals in scripture, I hope that you will start to recognize God's arrival in your everyday life too.

As the seasons turn to a time of holy darkness once again, I pray that you are able to enter into this time fully. When we work as a church to attune ourselves to God's surprising presence, we will witness how God has already been at work among us and our community all along.

Surprise! Pastor Emily

Create a "found object" Jesse Tree, and bring Advent worship into your home this year! Our *Out of the Blue* devotional includes an idea that marries tradition and whimsy: a "found object" Jesse tree.

The tradition of the Jesse tree originates in medieval times. It's a symbolic depiction of Jesus' family tree, and also a symbol of the Advent season, sometimes used for home devotions during the weeks leading to Christmas. When used at home, a Jesse tree tells the stories of Jesus' ancestors by using Bible stories and accompanying ornaments, one for each day of Advent. By Christmas, the Jesse tree is full of biblical imagery, and you've spent the season dwelling in stories of faith. Perhaps you already use a Jesse tree at home during the Advent season. In the traditional Jesse tree used for home devotions, the Bible stories are taken from the genealogy of Jesus as described in Matthew 1. The stories in our devotional are also drawn from Jesus' ancestors in Matthew 1, with a particular focus on the women in Jesus' lineage. It's unusual that women are listed as ancestors in scripture, so their inclusion stands out. Their stories give us important clues about who Jesus will be. But rather than using traditional ornaments, you'll create a Jesse tree from everyday items around your home, or found objects. You'll assemble the tree over the course of November and December, adding to it each week, as you follow the devotional guide. If you're thinking, "Could this end up looking a little... weird?" the answer is "Yes, definitely!" You may end the season with a vase of branches surrounded by a Band-Aid, a stuffed animal, a book, and a can of corn. For those who enjoy a carefully decorated home at Christmas, this may be a creative challenge. Embrace the chaos and be open to what it can teach you about God! We hope that at the end of the season you have an entirely unique and utterly meaningful collection of found objects to remind you of the eccentric cast of characters who comprise Jesus' family tree.


