## January 2025

Dear Friends in Christ,

Merry Christmas, Happy Hannukah, and a Blessed Epiphany to all. In our western Christian tradition, January 6<sup>th</sup> is celebrated as Epiphany. It is one of the three principal and oldest festival days of the Christian church along with Christmas and Easter. The first reference to Epiphany was at the end of the second century before Christmas was established.

It goes by other names in other cultures. In Hispanic and Latin cultures, as well as many places in Europe, it is known as Three King's Day. Because of the differences in church calendars between the eastern and the western churches, both Christmas and Epiphany have been observed at different times. Some of the Russian Orthodox and Serbian Orthodox churches still follow the older calendar, and so they celebrate Epiphany on January 19<sup>th</sup>. No matter – Epiphany is the climax of the Advent/Christmas Season; and contrary to popular belief, January 6<sup>th</sup> signals the end of the 12 Days of Christmas which is counted down from the evening of December 25<sup>th</sup> until the morning of January 6<sup>th</sup> which is the 12<sup>th</sup> day. So, in many cultures the twelfth night would provide an opportunity to celebrate...to feast and indulge in a piece of the King's cake.

Once when I was attending a meeting in Puerto Rico it just happened to be Three King's Day. There were festivals and parades, singing and dancing in the streets, and a gigantic cake which was carried through the streets by 20 plus people. And, of course, this is the day for gift giving. In England and her colonies (including America), the custom has been to give gifts on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. But in most of the rest of European, Mediterranean, and Latin American countries, Christians exchange gifts on Epiphany. In Liturgical Church traditions especially, celebrating the season of Christmas and the Season of Easter is not simply the day. So, we celebrate the season of Epiphany from January 6<sup>th</sup> until Ash Wednesday which begins the season of Lent and leads us to Easter. Depending on the timing of Easter, Epiphany can include from four to nine Sundays.

The term Epiphany means “to reveal,” to make known,” or “to show.” We remember the arrival of the wise men bringing gifts to visit the Christ child, who by so doing reveal Jesus to the world as Lord and King. We usually associate Epiphany with the Wise Men's arrival; and because of that, a tradition developed which people have enjoyed for years. On or around January 6<sup>th</sup>, the symbol +C+M+B+ with two numbers before and two numbers following (example 20+C+M+B+25) is inscribed in chalk above the doorway in your home. The letters are the initials of the traditional names of the Three Magi: Casper, Melchoir, and Balthasar. These letters also abbreviate the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat* – may Christ bless this house. The beginning and ending numbers are the year, 2025 in the example above. The crosses represent Christ.

Perhaps you may want to take up this tradition. Use this or similar words before you mark your door: “Peace be with this house, with all who live here and with all who enter here.” Then read Matthew 2:1-12 and end with this or a similar prayer: “O God of all that exists, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guiding of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill each of us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.”

You may ask star? Why a star? The star teaches us that we cannot find Jesus by ourselves. God leads us and by the prompting of the Holy Spirit we, like the wise men, are taught, showed, and the Lord Christ is revealed to us. So what is our star today? God’s word in the scripture, His presence in His body and blood of the sacrament, and the encouragement of the fellowship of believers – the Body of Christ.

On the first Sunday after the Epiphany we always observe the baptism of our Lord, and on the last Sunday of the season just before Ash Wednesday we always observe the Transfiguration of Jesus. These two occasions bracket the season of Epiphany and reveal most clearly who Jesus is: the divine Son of God. Remember that on both of these occasions the voice of God the father spoke from heaven saying, “This is my Son.”

The Epiphany Season is a wonderful time for us to focus on the mission of the church in reaching others by “showing” that Jesus is the Savior of all people. It is a time for us to look inward and ask ourselves how we might engage more fully in the mission of the church. Epiphany is also a time of focusing on Christian Community and fellowship, especially in healing any divisions which might be between or among us. So, as Epiphany approaches it looks as if we have a lot to do.

New Bishop's Visit - Augustana will host a dinner on March 23 when the Joint Council and both Call Committees meet with Bishop Graham.

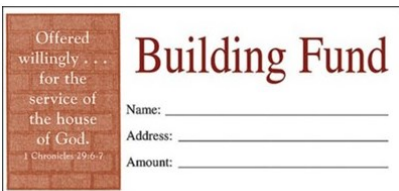
New Roof construction will begin in a few weeks and interior repairs from the water damage in the choir loft will be performed by Augustana and Pioneer Faith.

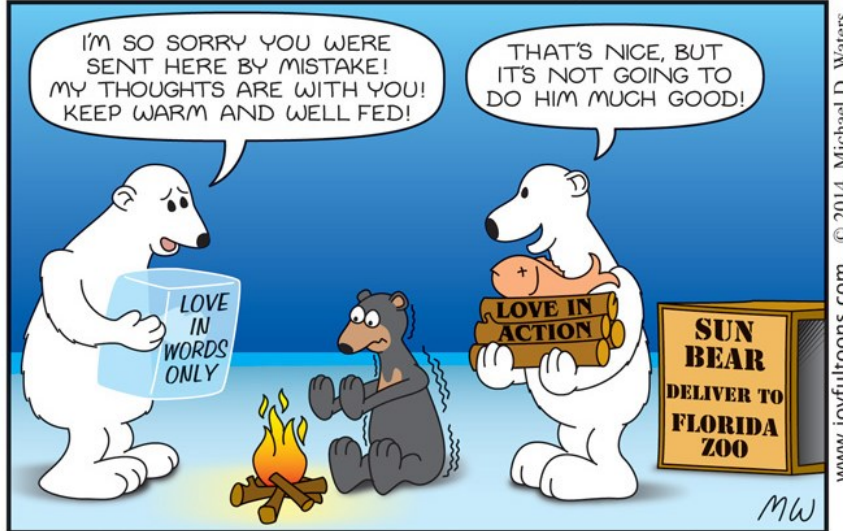

In her Christmas message, ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton calls our attention to the word “joy” in the angel’s proclamation to the shepherds. “Do not be afraid, for see, I am bringing you good news of a great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord.” (Luke 2:10-11). Eaton reminds us that the message of Christmas is joy, not happiness. Happiness is transient and humanmade. But joy given by God is deep and strong and unshakable. “Joy is a sign of the reign of God...Perhaps that is why in the middle of the night, to terrified shepherds, outside of a small town, God chose to send the angels to announce the birth of Jesus.
