Dear Friends in Christ,

Come to church.

You knew that one was coming! Church is the best way for us to cool down when the pressures of life, ministry, work, or family are hot. At our church you will always hear beautiful music, be reminded that you are loved and forgiven, and have intentional time to listen for God's voice.

I think our ministry together is going to continue to heat up for a while! So I pray that we also find ways to cool down, slow down, and seize the Sabbath rest to which we are called.



Founding Members Series Researched & Submitted by Diane Frickson

Second in a series about our founding fathers—Connected to Grace Lutheran Church, Mr. and Mrs. Johan Hulten are listed as charter members of Augustana. Johan Hulten came to America as Johan Johansson. However, his name was changed at Ellis Island like so many others that arrived in the United States.

He married Matilda Johannesdotter in 1871, two years before our church was founded, and they lived on Marion Street

Their children were Anna Marie, who married Winifred E. Warren, and a daughter, Martinena, named after her uncle, Martin Robert Hulten. Martinena Marie Hulten married L. J. Frechette, Jr. They had a son, John Frechette, who is a member of Grace Lutheran Church.



~ God's Gifts Pantry ~

The 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month is our pantry—we are open from 10-11, and most weeks we have several women waiting when we arrive at 9. This past Thursday, 36 people came and we passed out food for a record number of 157 people!! In the month of July, we distributed for 242 people in just 2 Thursdays!

What is involved in our pantry?

Twice a month we make a trip to Milford for restocking from the food bank there. We are given a time slot and have 45 minutes to make our selections. We never know what we will be able to get. There are bins of canned and boxed foods, personal care items, and occasionally cleaning items. We are given 5 tote bags that we fill as full as we can. Then it is on to the shelves where we select items that help fill our pantry shelves. Yes, we do get items that are a bit out of best by date. We pay .05 a pound and usually bring back about 6001b! When we are able to get meat, it is a big deal! Occasionally there are items that we can purchase at an additional discounted cost.

Then it's back to Elkhart to unload and put away what we have obtained. The day before pantry, we set up in the kitchen. The counter, by the sink, is where we have grouped items packaged to make a meal for the family. The center island has more groceries where they can choose 6 items (cereal, crackers, coffee, tea, etc.) To the right of the stove is our pasta area. Everyone can choose a pasta sauce, a pasta, a vegetable, a fruit, and a bread product. We also have beverages where they can pick one. To round things out, we have personal care items and cleaning items when we can get them. Each person can choose 2 of these items. Toilet paper goes quickly.

If you ever want to see how the pantry works, please feel free to stop in on a Thursday.

NOW what can you do to help with the pantry?

We can use cash donations. It costs to get food from the Food Bank in Milford. Several of us shop when we find a good deal on items. When you are shopping for groceries, pick up a couple extra items and add them to the bin in the hallway by the office. If you see a great price on an item you use, we have someone who can probably use it, too. If you are cleaning out your pantry and have an item you aren't using—donate it. Those items need to be unopened and not out of date. If you aren't sure, ask! We have a list of items that we can use. We can make cash go far.

Thanks for helping to make our pantry a safe place!
