"After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go." – Luke 10:1



Have you ever been working on a project with a group of people and thought to yourself, "I could really get this done a lot quicker if I just did the work."? Sometimes that might be true, but I do not think that demonstrates how we are called to live. The disciples and followers of Jesus were sent out into the world not by themselves, but always with companions on the journey. Companions to help, companions with complementary gifts, companions who they could share the good and the bad with.

Many pastors serve congregations alone. They may have a supportive spouse and there may be helpful people who serve as administrative assistants, musicians, and custodians, but they are expected to be a "jack of all trades," and to be an "expert in every nuance of ministry." To be honest, that's silly. Not only is it silly, but it's not faithful to the story of our faith that talks about the body of Christ and complementary gifts.

Part of what excites me about the conversations and work that Grace and Augustana have been doing is the possibility to share resources, particularly staff. In the coming months, you'll hear about some exciting changes that will allow us to live more fully into this faithful concept.

On January 27th, Sister Nora Frost was installed as Deacon at both Grace and Augustana. She will be helping with pastoral care, doing some teaching, and helping all of us to learn how to live out our faith in our daily lives. I have been energized in my planning conversations with her and look forward to the ways that she will help the people of Augustana and Grace grow in their faith, while also providing more comprehensive and timely pastoral care for our homebound members and those living in nursing homes.

We are also working with the Indiana-Kentucky Synod to jointly call a part-time interim pastor whose primary focus will be on developing youth programming for the younger members of Augustana and Grace. This individual will work to bring young people together around fellowship activities, service, and growing in faith. The process has started and hopefully we will have an individual in a few weeks.

And the work is not just done by Pastor Dan, Sister Nora, the new youth interim pastor, our musicians, and other paid staff – but it's work that we all do together. You have gifts. We hope that you will share them with others. We hope that you will let your light shine and be the person that God has called you to be!

Where God is doing new things

“Who is my neighbor in a world in which I might spend more time connected relationally to people on the other side of the globe than those across the street?”

[Dwight Zscheile]



On Christmas Day, I met for the first time our new neighbors who had moved into the house next door almost three months earlier. They happened to be outside with their kids, testing out a couple of Christmas presents, while I was walking our dogs. I was a bit embarrassed as I approached them to introduce myself. I apologized to them for not meeting and welcoming them to the neighborhood sooner. They were quite gracious, offered their own apologies, and we had a delightful getting-acquainted Christmas Day conversation with each other.

As I told my wife, Janet, about the meeting afterward, I remembered an article I had read some months before, the article from which the haunting question above comes: *Who Is My Neighbor? The Church's Vocation in an Era of Shifting Community* ([Word and World, Winter 2017](#)).¹ The author, Dwight Zscheile, is right: the shape and locus of human community is shifting significantly in this country, probably in ways that the church has not yet fully realized or begun to address.

Referencing the book, *The Vanishing Neighbor*, by Marc Dunkelman, Zscheile points out that:

Americans today spend more time with their intimates (immediate family and closest friends) as well as in an outer ring of loose social ties facilitated by social media and the Internet around specific interests. What is disappearing is the middle ring—traditionally the city neighborhood, village, or township where voluntary organizations like congregations exist. Expectations for neighborliness have changed—from block parties and potlucks, sharing tools and child care, to keeping to oneself and not interfering in your neighbor's business. Adults involved in intensive parenting spend more hours with their children, while these overscheduled children spend fewer hours roaming the neighborhood with their peers. Americans look to their devices to connect with people on social media who may be geographically far removed, ignoring the people next to them on the bus, street, or at the playground.

Not only does this shift suggest the loss of face-to-face (read: incarnational) relationships that can be nurturing and supportive, it also means that “People can now largely avoid relationships with those of differing views.” This may well be part of the reason that community in this country is so fractured and fractious...and/or part of the reason that we can't seem to find ways to live together in justice and peace, honoring differences and diversity, and working together for the common good.

So, my little Christmas Day encounter with our new neighbors has left me wondering: In this time and place, might we, the church, the body of the crucified and risen Christ, be called to intentionally and care-fully create face-to-face space for genuine local community to emerge. Might the good news of Christ crucified and risen for the life of the world be calling us to fill that “middle ring” of American life with confession, forgiveness, and reconciliation that leads to radical welcome, bold inclusion, and life together that shines with the light of new, abundant, and lasting life for all?

After all, as Dwight puts it, “In a world of eroding, divisions, and fragile community, the church stewards a most precious gift: God's restoration to communion of those once estranged in Christ, who joins us in the local, particular, and ordinary.”

Overnight housing is available on Friday night. There is also the option of a Friday evening activity.



John Metz opened the meeting with prayer. (Pastor Dan was out of town but joined the meeting via telephone).

Minutes from the December Council Meeting- John Metz asked if there were any questions or concerns on the minutes. Janet Ermis moved to accept the minutes, Bonnie Rice seconded. A unanimous vote carried.

Pledge/Giving report- John Metz asked if there were any questions or concerns on the report. Nichole Metz moved to accept the report, Doris Koontz seconded. A unanimous vote carried.

Treasurer's report- John Metz asked if there were any questions or concerns on the report. Janet Ermis moved to accept the report, Deb Rowland seconded. A unanimous vote carried.

Pastor's report-

*Pastor Dan did not give a regular report, but brought up new business of Sister Nora as visitation Deacon (see below).

Finance Committee – Randy Tinder noted that the budget was ready for the annual meeting on January 20.

Stewardship Committee – John Metz did not have anything to report, but talked about a tentative date for Consecration Sunday.

Parish Education Committee – John Metz did not have anything new to report.

Worship & Music Committee – AJ Diller noted that they had recently met and planned Hymns and Lessons through Transfiguration Sunday.

Social Ministry & Evangelism Committee – Deb Rowland did not have anything new to report

Endowment Committee – Brenda Miller was not at the meeting.

Memorial Committee – Janet Ermis did not have anything new to report.

Property Committee – Brad Ganczak was not at the meeting.

Old Business:

* A reminder that on March 1st and 2nd there will be a joint council retreat for Augustana and Grace.

* Grace and Augustana will be sharing Lent services this year, a schedule will be coming.

New Business:

*Sister Nora-Visitation Deacon. Pastor Dan informed the council that Sister Nora had expressed some interest in serving both congregations helping with visitation and teaching. This would free up the interim person to focus on youth and discernment for Augustana and Grace coming together. Pastor Dan recommended \$500 a month for her services from the "youth pastor" line item of the budget. That would leave more than enough money still for the interim. The council



Attendance was 32 members, so a quorum was reached. Janet Ermis greeted the members.

The first item on the agenda was electing three new members for the church council for the normal three-year term, and one member to complete a two-year term for a member who resigned. Also, to elect two new members for three-year terms on the endowment committee. The ballot included, for council: Gunnar Erickson, Keith Johnson, Maralee Macumber, Don & Dee Smith, and Heidi Scupham. And for endowment: both spots were open. After some discussion Gunnar Erickson pulled himself from the council ballot and joined volunteer, Jerry Duck, to fill the two endowment spots. This left four candidates for the four council spots, Keith Johnson filled the two-year term, and Maralee Macumber, Don & Dee Smith, and Heidi Scupham filled the three-year terms. Dave Ermis motioned to accept these results, Jerry Duck seconded the motion, and the results were accepted with a majority vote.

Next on the agenda was the proposed 2019 budget. The question was raised on where in the budget Pastor Dan's salary would come from, the answer was under 'pulpit supply.' Jerry Duck motioned to accept the proposed budget, AJ Diller seconded the motion, and the proposed budget was accepted with a majority vote.

Next on the agenda were the Pastor and Committee Reports. Jerry Duck motioned to accept these reports, Deb Rowland seconded the motion, and the reports were accepted with a majority vote.

There was no 'Old Business' reported.

Under 'New Business,' the items discussed were:

- The time line for the coming together of Augustana and Grace.
- The quarter-time person to help with ministry work for both Augustana and Grace- what this person would do and why they are needed.
- Concern that people need to have more information given out to the congregation about what is happening with Augustana and Grace.


The move to adjourn the meeting was made by Jerry Duck, Brad Ganczak seconded the motion, and approved by a majority vote.

Lutherwald's Toboggan Weekend is Saturday late afternoon through Sunday morning retreat for middle school and high school youth groups and their adult sponsors. Cost is \$35 per person and includes two meals, snacks and Saturday night housing--cost for tobogganing is extra.

The Toboggan Run at Pokagon State Park is a 1,780 ft. (1/3 of a mile) refrigerated twin track--no snow or cold weather is needed for it to operate. Cost: \$7 per vehicle (\$9 out-of-state) for entrance into park and toboggan rental is \$13 an hour (four people per toboggan).
