Dear Friends in Christ:

certainly doesn't happen on our own without the guidance and direction of the Holy Spirit.

If 2023 has been a difficult and challenging year, then you are probably ready to be done with it. If you have been running around like that chicken with its little head cut off, then you are probably grateful to see 2023 in the rear view mirror as you look forward to starting a new chapter in your book of life. Just don't forget who gave you the book in the first place. So, start early before 2024 even begins. Take a healthy and reflective approach as you invite God into your plans for the year ahead. Express your gratitude first to God who has given us absolutely everything and everybody in our lives. But also express your gratitude to others for what they have done for you and for what they have meant in your life. It is well known that gratitude lifts our spirits. Take time to reflect on the many prayers God answered last year though they may not have been answered in exactly the way you had hoped. Then make a plan to set aside specific times of prayer each and every day...times when you can just pour your heart out to the God who is just waiting and longing to hear from you. 



- Perpetua (d. ca. 202), North African martyr and visionary writer

Dr. Schroeder will discuss these women's inspirational lives and writings.

The Rev. Dr. Joy Schroeder, an ELCA pastor, is Professor of Church History at Capital University, where she teaches in the Department of Religion and Philosophy and Trinity Lutheran Seminary. She holds the Trinity Chair in Lutheran Heritage. Dr. Schroeder earned a B.A. in Classics from Luther College, a Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary, and a Ph.D. from the University of Notre Dame. She is the author of five books on the history of how Christians and Jews have interpreted scripture. Her most recent book, co-authored with Marion Ann Taylor (University of Toronto) is Voices Long Silenced: Women Biblical Interpreters through the Centuries (Westminster John Knox Press, 2022).
