# **Excess Baggage**

In the last century, a tourist from America paid a visit to a renowned Polish rabbi, Hofetz Chaim. He was astonished to see that the rabbi's home was only a simple room filled with books, plus a table and bench.

"Rabbi," asked the tourist, "where is your furniture?"

"Where is yours?" replied Hofetz Chaim.

"Mine?" asked the puzzled American." But, I'm only a visitor here. I'm only passing through."

"So am I," said the rabbi.

Experienced travelers learn how much baggage is just enough. They take what they need and leave behind the non-essentials that would only be a burden. To move freely, they travel light. Visitor, traveler, pilgrim - whatever word we use - each one of us is only "passing through."

How we go through life depends a lot on what each of us decides is essential in the things we own, the attachments we form, the ideas that shape our lives.

More and more people say they'd like to make changes in the way they live. Louis Harris commented that we may be coming to the point "where accumulation of physical possessions and steadily increasing consumption would no longer be as central to people's concerns...This would mark a striking turn-around in the country's thinking."

But any major change in the way we live is going to require decisions by millions of individuals, in their personal and public lives, in answer to the question: "How do I want to travel?"

On a personal level, questions like these may be helpful to anyone who is serious about finding out what to hold onto and what to let go:

- \*What possessions do I have that cause more trouble and worry than they're worth?
- \*Do I weight myself down by longing for more than I need or can afford?
- \*Do I waste valuable time and energy on things that don't really matter?
- \*Does the desire for "bigger, better, more" crowd out the values of intimacy, commnication and the giving of affection?
  - \*Do I feel good about my work, the persons in my life, myself.
  - \*If I had only three months to live, what would I let let go of and what would I hold on to?

# Where God is doing new things

Meeting in West Lafayette, Indiana, at the Purdue Memorial Union at Purdue University under the theme "Who is My Neighbor?," this year's Synod Assembly provided ample opportunity for worship, learning, fellowship, service, and for attending to the business of the synod.

Meeting May 31 – June 2, 2019, there were 3 keynote speakers. Pastor Tim Taylor currently serves as Pastor of Grace Lutheran Church in

Raleigh, NC. Pastor Taylor has led many workshops and spoken on the topic of diversity in our society. Pastor Sharon Taylor has more than thirty years of experience in youth ministry, including working at Beisler Camping and Retreat Center where she met her husband Pastor Tim Taylor. She currently serves as Senior Pastor at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Raleigh, NC. She and her husband led diversity training for the volunteers at this past summer's ELCA Youth Gathering in Houston. Pastor Mandy France serves as a solo pastor at Our Savior's Lutheran in Bird Island, MN. While at Luther Seminary she took several classes on interfaith relations during her studies at Luther and formed her pastoral internship project around Christian and Muslim dialogue. Her project, Love Thy Neighbor, gained national attention and was featured in the Washington Post and on Katie Courle's series "America Inside Out."

Judith Roberts was our Churchwide Representative and presented the ELCA Churchwide Report to the Assembly. Judith serves as ELCA Program Director for Racial Justice. The work of the ELCA Racial Justice ministries educates, equips and engages leaders to analyze the systems of racism and identify solutions that create equitable outcomes within and outside of the ELCA. We heard about the work of the churchwide expression of the church and learned about the ways in which we are called to live out our baptismal identities.



activities, students also helped lead the Opening Eucharist and Sunday morning's Sending Eucharist.

Rachel Kurtz served as the musician for this year's Assembly. Rachel shared the ways that God is at work in her life through her music and through stories.

High school students and adult faith mentors participated in the Youth Leadership Summit held in conjunction with Synod Assembly. Students heard from our Assembly keynote speakers as well as from Rachel Kurtz. In addition to leadership development

A woodwind trio, bass guitar, guitar, saxophone, conga drums, and Assembly Choir added to the festival sound. Participants from the Youth Leadership Summit, held in conjunction with Synod Assembly, led the procession. The Rev. Dr. Donald K. Gillett II, Executive Director of the Kentucky Council of Churches preached a powerful sermon. On Saturday evening we prayed Evening Prayer and had a time of Remembrance of the Faithful Departed. The Sending Eucharist also featured a variety of musical styles. Cory Thomas Pechan Driver and Travis Woodfield were

Consecrated to the Ministry of Word and Service. It was a very festive service!



For the second year in a row, there were 7 Affinity Groups, an open-space time, where those in attendance had the opportunity to learn from one another. "It was a great time of sharing and discussion, thank you!" is how one participant described the experience. Twelve different workshops were offered on Saturday afternoon. Topics ranged from Love Thy Neighborl, led by Pastor Mandy France, to the Opioid Crisis in America, led by Kal William Rissman.

A highlight for many was the screening of "Won't You Be My Neighbor?", a 2018 American documentary film directed by Morgan Neville about the life and guiding philosophy of Fred Rogers, the host and creator of Mister Rogers' Neighborhood.

The offering collected on Friday evening and designated for the ACE Food Pantry totaled \$2778.91 and the offering collected on Sunday morning and designated for HKBP Disaster Relief totaled \$2461.10. The Assembly also adopted the Synod Budget for 2020-2021 and elected persons to serve on Synod Council and several Synod committees.

MissionFest provided a venue to learn more about a variety of ministries of the synod, ELCA, and within our mission territory.
