Dear friends in Christ;

Fear and Faith...these words have been shared with me frequently over these last few months. "I know God is in control so I just have to have faith." "I fear that with prices going up I won't have enough retirement funds to last." "I fear we will not get a pastor and then what will happen to us." "My faith is in Christ so even if the diagnosis is cancer... He's got me." I have been struggling with waffling between fear and faith as well. While at Martin's grocery store the man in front of me had a gun on his belt and my hospital training automatically started to run through my head. What do I do if there is a mass shooting.....RUN,HIDE,FIGHT.....the man was right in front of me so fear kicked in. Realizing that we were pretty close to each other I ruled out the run or hide part of my training and skipped right to the fight mode. Should I kick him, hit him, or just run my shopping cart into his back side knocking the gun off his belt allowing me to quickly kick it into another checkout lane. But then faith took over when the man turned around excusing himself to pick up a Reader's Digest from a rack right in front of me. He was a police officer. All was well. No fighting necessary. Sometimes I am confident that God is in control; and I have all the faith needed to manage the day. But at other times, I feel fearful. Sometimes I doubt that God has meaningful work for me to do during this stage in my life, or I am afraid of some of the effects of aging



#### Bishop William O. Gafkjen Reelected as Bishop of Indiana-Kentucky Synod, ELCA!

CHICAGO (June 14, 2022) — The Rev. William O. Gafkjen, Indianapolis, was reelected on June 9, 2022, to serve a third sixyear term as bishop of the Indiana-Kentucky Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election was held during the synod assembly, June 9-11 at the Horizon Convention Center in

The bishop was reelected on the first ballot with 204 votes. A total of 192 votes was needed for election. Gafkjen has served as bishop since 2010. Prior to his election, he was assistant to the bishop of the synod from 2002 to 2010. Previously he served congregations in Minnesota, Michigan, Pennsylvania, and Indiana. Gafkjen earned a Bachelor of Arts from St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minn., in 1979 and a Master of Divinity from Luther Seminary in St. Paul,

Minn., in 1985. He received a Doctor of Ministry in Gospel and Culture from Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Ga.



### Report from the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Synod Assembly at the Horizon Convention Center in Muncie, Indiana

The Synod Assembly met from Thursday, June 9<sup>th</sup>- June 11<sup>th</sup>, 2022 under the theme "The Grace in which We Live". Compared to other Assemblies this Assembly had fewer registrants with the total in attendance being 317 which represented 111 rostered Ministers (Pastors and Deacons), 164 voting members (male and female from congregations from Indiana and Kentucky) and 40 visitors. This was an election year for Bishop and Bishop Bill Gafjkjen was re-elected for another six-year term on the first ballot with 204 votes. 192 votes was needed for election.

Conference Minister in the Indiana-Kentucky Conference the United Church of Christ. He is the author of a couple of of books focusing on creativity and discernment among local churches. His latest book, "Incline your ear: Cultivating Spiritual Awakening in Congregations" was the basis for his presentation.

The Rev. Dr. Anthony Bateza who is a Dr. Martin Luther, moral theology, and Christian ethics specialist also spoke. He is a professor at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Mn. and an ELCA Pastor. His research which was shared in his presentation examined Luther's political theology. He connected theology, Biblical scholarship and the contemporary challenges we all face.

There were four times throughout the Assembly for Spiritual Practices and Special Music. Lisa Kramme who serves as the Director of Faith Formation in the Nebraska Synod of the ELCA provided opportunities for the Assembly to experience and practice a variety of Spiritual Practices. The musician Rev. John Tirro is an ELCA pastor who serves as Pastor of Congregational Life and Campus Ministry for St. John's Lutheran Church/Tyson House Episcopal and Lutheran Campus Ministry at Yale Divinity School in Knoxville, Tennessee, He is also a songwriter, composer and musician. He is a staff songwriter for Universal Music Group and Staff Songwriter for Sony/ATV. As well as writing hymns, songs, and liturgical settings of worship he has written secular music for many well-known country artists. You can check out his music on YouTube. A couple of my favorites include: "The Sails Were Spilling Wind", "Does Anybody Know Somebody" and "There's Wilderness All Around Us".

The ELCA Churchwide Representative was **Deacon Mary Ann Schwabe** who serves on the Churchwide staff as
Executive for Synod Relations. She made a brief presentation,
preached at the Sending Worship and Installed our re-elected
Bishop.

ed which included Pastor Ken Peterson who served at Augustana and Pastor William Powlen who was ordained and served at Grace. Both celebrated 50 years. Congregation Anniversaries of 25, 75, 100, 125, 150, 175, and 200 years were also celebrated.

Offerings from all worship services was designated for the Indiana Kentucky Synod Disaster Fund to aid Mayfield Kentucky and the surrounding area which was devastated by the December outbreak of the 30 tornados which swept through six states. In-kind donations of canned goods and other food items were also received for Second Harvest Food Bank in Muncie.

During business session the assembly adopted new Compensation guidelines for Pastors and Deacons. Both congregation council's have been given this document as we move ahead towards calling staff.

Each attendee was able to attend two breakout sessions. The first I attended was "From Sitting Around the Table to Setting the Table: A New Approach to Church Council Meetings." This material was the result of a doctoral project leading to the thesis by the presenter: Rev. Dr. Eric C. Schlichting from St. John, Indiana. The second breakout session was on "Shared Ministries". The handout "Discernment and Discussion Guide" can be found on page 7 in this newsletter. There were several congregational leaders both rostered ministers and lay leaders who spoke about their experiences in moving into shared ministry.

There was a Gathering Worship on Thursday and a Sending Worship on Saturday with the Friday night worship being a Remembrance of the Faithful Departed which included Pastors, Deacons and their spouses who have died since the last Assembly.

There was just one Memorial to vote on this year: A Memorial to Uphold the Dignity of the Office of Ministry. This memorial asks the 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly



Shared Ministry Conversations Indiana-Kentucky Synod, ELCA Updated 5.30.2022

### Indiana-Kentucky Synod Shared Ministry Discernment and Discussion Guide

Shared Ministry in the Indiana-Kentucky Synod is described as two or more congregations sharing pastoral leadership (and perhaps other staff) while also sharing some mission and ministry. If your congregation is interested in exploring shared ministry with one or more other congregations, please contact Pastor Nancy Nyland, DEM, at <a href="mailto:nnyland@iksynod.org">nnyland@iksynod.org</a>.

#### What is Shared Ministry?

- > It is NOT about closing, merging or making the congregations alike.
- > It is about maintaining the unique identity of each congregation while sharing leadership and jointly participating in some mission and ministry.
- > It is about being attentive to the Holy Spirit and the opportunities being offered for shared mission and ministry.
- > It is about having a full-time pastor that your congregation is sharing.
- > It is about freeing up resources to do mission and ministry.
- > It is about gifts. No matter how big or how small, each congregation brings gifts into the partnership.
- > It is NOT about surviving....it IS about thriving.
- > It is about purpose. What is God calling your congregation to do and to be in the future? How will this shared ministry strengthen your mission and ministry? How will your congregation's relationship with God, one another and the world grow in this shared ministry?
- > It is about risk and experimentation. As Bishop Bill says, "Let's throw our loaves and fish on the table and see how God might multiply them."
- > It is about open communication and relationship building first with leaders and then with the entire congregation.
- > It is about establishing a high trust level between the pastor, the lay leaders and the congregations.
- > It is about compromise. What areas need compromise to make the shared leadership successful (i.e., worship times, midweek services, special services, annual meetings, etc.)?
- > It is about strong lay leadership. How will lay leaders be responsible for tasks which previously were considered the pastor's responsibility?
- > It is not about unseating a called pastor. If one of the congregations currently has a called pastor, this pastor will be the first candidate to be considered in the call process.
- > It is about imagining and exploring various staffing models, as appropriate....ministers of word and sacrament (pastors); ministers of word and service (deacons); interns from seminary; shared administrative assistant, youth leader, music director, custodial staff, etc.
- > It is about participating in a discernment process with another congregation(s) involving several meetings with congregational leaders facilitated by synod staff.
- > It is about developing a shared ministry covenant (a sample covenant is available from the synod office).




