Dear Friends in Christ,

During our April meeting of the Ministerium we reviewed the ELCA's Draft of a Social Statement on Civic Life and Faith. The Task Force is now at the point of seeking public comment on the document which is the result of three years of study which included listening sessions, hours of reading, study by members of the task force, discussion, and grappling with the critical, contemporary, and vexing matters around Civic Life and Faith. All this in an attempt to bring this document to common conviction and expression. Feedback is being accepted through September 30, 2024, at which time the task force will edit the draft in light of public input. The proposed draft will be submitted to the ELCA Church Council who will vote on sending it on to the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in 2025. If adopted by a 2/3's margin, the social statement will become the official social teaching of this church and as such will govern church teaching, policies, and ministries. It will also serve as a tool for all members of the ELCA as we individually or as a congregation think about civic life.

I would encourage everyone to read the document which comes in an "abridged version" (which, in my humble opinion, leaves significant room for confusion and various misunderstandings) and the "full version" which is more tedious to read (55 pages) but which brings significant light and explanation to the Social Statement from a theological, doctrinal, Biblical and spiritual perspective. Though it is impossible in this article to give justice to this statement let me highlight the sections which are addressed: I. Fundamental Teaching: God's Activity Toward Well-being Through Civic Life; II. The Calling to Robust Civic Participation; III. Assessing the U.S. Constitutional Form of Government; IV. Religion and the First Amendment; V. Describing the Constructive Relationships of Religious Organizations and Political Authority; VI. Addressing Selected Contemporary Concerns in Civic Life. Go to https://www.ELCA.org/ civicsandfaith to read the Draft, comment with your opinions and suggestions on the survey, and learn more about individuals on the task force. There is also a study curriculum on Civic Life and Faith which wrestles with what it means to be disciples of Christ in a democracy - to serve God as citizens, as residents, and as a community of faith. The Draft Social Statement as well as the study materials includes a helpful glossary.

So why do I bring this up in my May Newsletter article? Because every year on the first Thursday of May our country observes the National Day of Prayer. The National Day of Prayer exists to mobilize unified public prayer for America. We are invited to pray for our Nation and to intercede for our nation: federal government (President, Vice-President, Cabinet members, Congressional leaders, Supreme Court Justices); state government (Governor, Executive leaders, Legislative leaders, Judicial leaders); and local government (Mayor, City Counsel, Police Chief, Fire Chief, Judges, County Officials); our military, media, business, education, church, and family.

The theme this year is **Lift Up The Word** – **Light Up The World**. The theme comes from 2 Samuel 22:29-31: "For you are my lamp, O Lord, and my God lightens my darkness. For by You I can run against a troop, and by my God I can leap over a wall. This God – his way is perfect: the word of the Lord proves true; He is a shield for all those who take refuge in Him." 

<u>First Communion Class</u> to be held in April for youth and adults.



Two Important Church Festivals in May Ascension Day & The Day of Pentecost

Forty days after Easter, the church celebrates the Ascension of our Lord, who ascended into heaven not only as God but also as man. The color of Ascension Day is white. This year we again have the opportunity to join with Lutherans throughout our North Central conference on May 9th at 7 PM at Hilltop Lutheran Church of the Ascension in South Bend, Indiana just one block off the corner of Ireland Rd. on Ironwood from the 20 Bypass. If you plan to attend, let Sister Nora know so a reservation can be made or call directly at 215-920-9119.

Then the final Sunday of the Easter season (fifty days after Easter) is the Celebration of The Day of Pentecost on May 19th. This Festival was adopted by the early Christians to commemorate the first great harvest of believers for Christ. Therefore, Pentecost is seen as the birthday of the church, as the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples and they gave their compelling witness about the resurrected Lord. The color of the Day of Pentecost is red, representing fire and blood. Red recalls the tongues of fire received on the first Pentecost and all the martyrs who shed their blood for the faith. The Day of Pentecost begins the long green season (color is green) of the Sundays after Pentecost. There are twenty-six Sundays after Pentecost which take us to the last Sunday of the Church Year – Christ the King Sunday (Nov. 24th). Many of our Gospel readings will come from the Gospel of Saint Mark but we will also enjoy many of the bread texts from the Gospel of Saint John throughout the summer.


