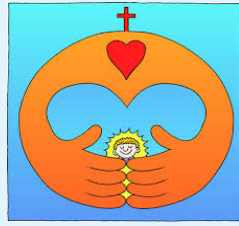

A Stewardship Minute

November 2019

“The only ultimate value in our lives is the love God for us.” This sentence is packed with a salient truth! Notice the words: “Ultimate” means last or final or utmost. “Value” means worth or importance. “The love God has for us” focuses upon the deep personal affection God has for each of us. Think of God’s everlasting love surrounding us, supporting us, and blessing us every second of our lives.

Even in difficult times, that truth should make our lives hum with confidence, assurance, faith, hope, and love. Think of it! The love of our Creator for each of us ... and we cannot be separated from it ... ever. What amazing grace!

Yes, we have the freedom to ignore it, shun it and even doubt it. Yet the New Testament tells us God’s eternal love for us is an unwavering fact.

The November issue of *Stewardship* points out that this is the ultimate value in our lives. Surely that reality leaves us with our hearts bursting with gratitude. It makes us want to offer our gratitude to God day in and day out. In fact, every day should be a day of thanksgiving, don’t you think?

Furthermore, because God showers us with love, our response should be to love God and others in return. Our sense of thanksgiving should compel us to give, to share, and to be good stewards of time, talent, and substance.

Where God is doing new things

November 2019



Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. (Luke 18:1)

Listen, God is calling, through the Word inviting, offering forgiveness, comfort and joy. (ELW #513)

Pray always. Do not lose heart.

What is the intimate connection between these two needs, not commands, as Luke portrays them? Is prayer, constant prayer, prayer in all situations, a key to avoid losing heart? Does losing heart, becoming discouraged or disillusioned, become a barrier to active prayer?

And, by the way, how is your prayer life – and that of our faith community – these days in which it is so, so tempting to give up and give in, to lose heart?

In her helpful book Help, Thanks, Wow author Anne Lamott suggests that these three words capture the three essential prayers. In many ways, I think that she is right. From Genesis to Revelation, scripture is filled with cries for help, expressions of gratitude, and wide-eyed wonder at the works of God.

But I also wonder whether we need to be reminded that “praying always” also suggests listening, the kind of listening that any life-giving, relationship-growing conversation requires. Perhaps a book about that form of prayer would simply be entitled, What?

Listening prayer may be the most important – and most overlooked – form of prayer for the church and all the baptized Spirit-sealed people of God at times like our time, when it is so easy to lose heart, when so much of what we hear, experience, and feel is about loss, decline, diminishment, and uncertainty.

Listening prayer begins with questions like: What is God’s narrative, God’s story, about the present and the future? Or, better, listening prayer begins like this: *Gracious God, what are you saying to us, to me, in this challenging time? What are you up to? What needs to change in my life in order for me to follow faithfully?*

Such listening prayer begins with deep, slow, careful, exploratory listening to scripture and tradition, both for the promises of God that have sustained and guided God’s people through the centuries and for the stories of what God’s deliverance looked like when the promises were fulfilled (hint: it was seldom what God’s people first imagined it would be when they started listening).

Listening prayer arises from hearts and minds that learn to listen below the surface of the routine humdrum of daily life for the God who is present and speaking right now, in this moment. It calls us to intentionally let go of what we think should happen and open ourselves to whatever God’s Spirit may be saying and through whom God may be saying it. After all, God often speaks through those through whom we least expect God to speak, as old Balaam discovered [see Numbers 22:22-35].

Listening prayer invites us to let go of the need to always speak and, instead, to be quiet for a time, to create “empty” and expectant space in our hearts, our days, our life together for God to fill with God’s Word by the power of God’s Spirit for the sake of God’s renewing work in us and in our world.

Listen, dear people of God: Pray always and do not lose heart.

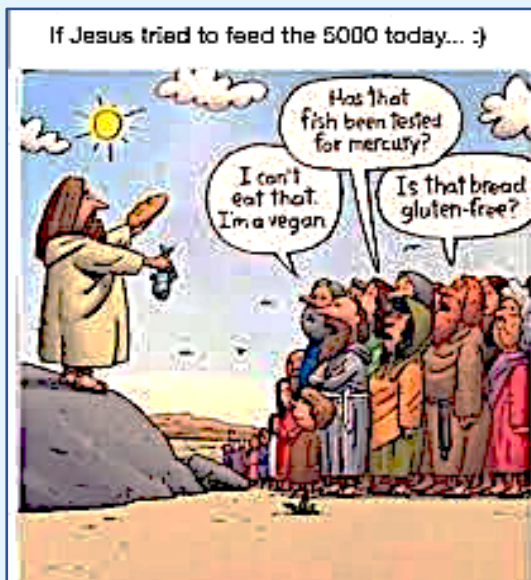

All Saints Day

The festival of All Saints occurs just as the landscape in the Northern Hemisphere heralds the dying of plants and the quiet of winter rest. In like manner, the readings and liturgy of this day call us to rejoice in all the saints: those who have died and now rest in Christ, those those who live now, and those yet to come.

As the church year draws to a close, we hear warnings about the end of time, stories of crisis and judgement, and parables of loss and death. The Christian community speaks honestly about human frailty and mortality. At the same time, we confess our faith in the risen Lord, in the communion of saints, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. While both life and death may bring us fear and uncertainty, the liturgy calls us to hear the Lord's promise that he is with us in life and in death. Christ has claimed us in baptism and nourishes us in the communion of his body and blood. Christ leads us to the new Jerusalem. There we shall join all the saints in praise of God, who has turned our graves into the doorway to eternal life.

Foster Grandparent Program
 REAL Services has a program that sends seniors age 55 and older into schools and childcare facilities to mentor at-risk children. Teachers identify students who are falling behind in areas such as reading, writing, math, self-esteem, socialization, etc. and assigns them to a Foster Grandparent to help them improve. The Foster Grandparents serve a minimum of 15 to 20 hours a week and earn an hourly stipend of \$2.65 if they meet income requirements.
