At the end of August, the congregations of Augustana and Grace took a courageous vote that said, "We want to continue to deepen our relationship so that we can determine how best to serve God and the people of our community." By voting to continue and enter into more formal conversations about consolidation, we can begin to see what a shared future together may look like. I'm grateful for the ways that you have supported this work by having conversations, listening, and asking helpful questions that assist the leadership of the church in making the best decisions possible.

Over the last month, we have begun the process of developing teams of individuals who will lead this work in different areas: Building, Communication, Traditions/Culture, Mission/Name/Constitution, Finances/Legal, Staff, Worship/Music, and Youth. There were sign-up sheets for individuals to express their interest and willingness to serve on one of these teams to help us make recommendations to the council and congregation about how to move forward in the consolidation process. I ask that you would pray for those on these teams and reach out to them when you have questions, concerns, and affirmations.

The goal has always been to find the ways that we can best serve the people that we are already serving, while also growing in the ways that we grow, share, praise, and serve. We believe that by coming together,

we can do that in a deeper way and live more fully into the calling of what it means to be church.

I hope that you engage this process and share your gifts to help it go as smoothly as possible--provoking one another to love and good deeds by encouraging one another. As we listen to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, I'm grateful that you are part of this community.

The Indiana-Kentucky Synod Transformational Leadership Academy has launched! As the TLA grows in coming months it will offer robust theological, spiritual, and practical formation for the whole people of God across the Indiana-Kentucky mission territory and beyond.

The first tile in the mosaic of the TLA is focused on the training and formation of Synod Lay Worship Leaders. A Synod Lay Worship Leader is a member of a congregation or other faith community of this synod who has been trained at the synod level and approved by the bishop for preaching and leading worship on an occasional basis for other congregations of the Synod. The formation consists of a series of seminars and classes covering Bible, Lutheran theology and practice, preaching, worship leadership, spirituality and prayer, and boundaries training. See the list of courses here: <https://conta.cc/31Tpljn>. Those who successfully complete the training and formation and are approved by the bishop will be added to the synod's pulpit supply list and, thereby, made available for pulpit supply across this synod.

In alignment with commitments and practices shared across the ELCA, Synod Lay Worship Leaders do not have automatic or blanket authorization to preside at Holy Communion. Such authorization is only considered by the bishop on an instance by instance basis as congregations request such authorization for a particular day and location. See the document "Who Presides?" (<https://bit.ly/2koTU0w>) for this synod's policies and practices in this regard.

By the way, you don't have to want to be a Synod Lay Worship Leader to participate in the courses! All members of the synod (and neighboring synods), rostered and lay, are invited to participate in these courses, either the entire curriculum or ala carte as certain courses look interesting to you. And, in coming months, we will add more tiles to the TLA section of the synod ministry mosaic by offering webinars and seminars, courses and classes in various venues to provide spiritual, biblical, theological, and practical growth opportunities on a wide variety of topics for the whole people of God, including, but not limited to, spirituality, Bible, training for congregation council officers, assisting worship minister training, mission and evangelism, continuing education for rostered ministers, Lutheran theology today, discipleship for a new day...

He previously worked to ascertain the feasibility and sustainability of an Arabic-language worshipping community in the ELCA's Southern Ohio Synod under the auspices of the ELCA's Arab and Middle Eastern Ethnic and Multicultural Ministry team. Cory is the proud and grateful husband of Sarah and father of Gabriel and Nahshon.



The foremost goal of the Transformational Leadership Academy (TLA) is to partner with lay and rostered leaders to provide the training and skills they need to provide effective leadership in their congregations and for congregations that do not have called ministers of Word and Sacrament. The TLA will also assist in the formation of TEEM (Theological Education for Emerging Ministries) candidates as well as provide continuing education opportunities to rostered ministers. The TLA will use a combination of learning modalities; including traditional in-person education, teleconferencing and recorded instruction to serve people where they are. As the Director, Cory will be meeting with stakeholders to identify what educational needs exist in the synod, and how we can use the abundant educational resources of the I-K Synod, including the many teaching theologians in the synod, to meet those needs. As the TLA grows and progresses, Dr. Driver will also teach courses and continue to oversee development of the programs.

Report on the Indiana-Kentucky Synod Women of the ELCA Convention

On September 13th and 14th 34 women (18 voting members plus guests and visitors) from Indiana and Kentucky gathered at the Indianapolis Airport Holiday Inn for worship, study, service projects, and business under the theme, "Come to the Well...Leave it all Behind". No president was elected but before the close of the meeting one of the elected board members agreed to be appointed by the board to serve as President. The board is still in need of four additional voting and non-voting Board Members. If you feel God may be calling you to get involved in this way, please see Diane Erickson. We give thanks for the willingness of Diane Erickson who has agreed to serve as Vice-President. There was a moving video on Free the Girls. This is the organization for which we have been collecting bras. We all were given new insights into the horrific effects of human trafficking and the prevalence of it even here in our own country. Pastor Vicki Garber gave a moving sermon and Bible Study which was a highlight of the convention. You may find copies of both in the narthex at Grace and on the tables leading into the Fellowship Hall at Augustana. Amy Shelly who attends Grace and Shamaya Bell who attends Augustana as well as Mary Ziegler from Zion in Bristol rode with Sister Nora to the conference.

Parish Education Committee – Heidi Scupham noted that there had been no stewardship meeting held or scheduled.

Worship & Music Committee – AJ Diller reported that the committee had met and planned through Advent.

Social Ministry & Evangelism Committee – Bonnie Rice reported that there had been no meeting held or scheduled.

Endowment Committee – Don and Dee Smith reported that there was no meeting held or scheduled.

Memorial Committee – Janet Ermis noted that there was no meeting held or scheduled.

Property Committee – Keith Johnson noted that he had forwarded an email to Dave Ermis and Brad Ganczak that he had received from secretary, Kathy Nowak, on several repairs that were needed around the church. A plan has not been made to look into these repairs.

Old Business:

*Minutes from the August 25th Special Congregational Meeting were distributed in the council packet and reviewed.

New Business:

*Received a final notice on corner lot on corner of Redding and 2nd Street.



Special Congregational Meeting August 25th, 2019

The meeting was held at Grace Lutheran Church, and was called to order at 10:31am.

There was one topic only and that was "to approve council's recommendation for Augustana Lutheran Church to move into a formal consolidation process with Grace Lutheran Church."

Augustana has 147 confirmed, communing, contributing voting members. 10% was needed for the quorum which means we needed 15 for a quorum. We had 42 members present. 39 votes were yes, 2 no votes and one invalid ballot. It was moved, seconded and carried.

After the vote was taken Pastor came up to tell us that at Grace's meeting the motion was amended to require that a final vote be taken before the consolidation process was completed. Augustana members were asked if they were ok with that and most people said they assumed there would have to be a last vote. We did not see a written copy of the amendment. AJ asked for volunteers to count the ballots, Emily Moyer and Jerry Duck volunteered.

We adjourned to the fellowship hall to hear the results from the voting and from there it was moved/seconded/carried.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:47am.
