

Dear Friends in Christ,

Lately, it seems like I can't escape the claim that Americans are *too polarized*. Pundits, podcasters, and personal acquaintances all cry out that those with different beliefs don't live near one another, talk to one another, or even care about one another anymore. And with the rise of political violence in our country, disagreement about how to protect our children from school shootings, conflict over how or even if to welcome immigrants, and many more controversies to point out, it is hard to brush off this claim entirely.

Yet I also think there's a lot of evidence against that claim. And it's sitting in our pews every Sunday. Each week in worship, we have folks in our pews from one end of the political spectrum to the other and at many points in between. There are people who would never dream of voting for others' candidate of choice. There are folks who pay attention to vastly different media outlets. There are those among us who try their hardest to avoid politics entirely, too.

Politics aren't our only difference. This season of transition in our church brings to the front the vast range of commitments people have when it comes to our ministries: those who desperately want more children in church and those who could do without the hassle, those who long to try new music and mix things up in worship and those who want to stick to the "oldies," those who think ministries of service like our food pantries are most important and those who crave a focus on faith development through things like bible studies.

This isn't even to mention our combined worship Sundays. On those Sundays, we bridge perhaps the greatest polarization we face—the divide between Augustana and Grace!

I think those who believe Americans are too polarized to get along haven't spent much time in a church pew lately, at least not in the pews of a mainline Protestant church like ours. Each Sunday we walk through the sanctuary doors and sit down with folks who don't think the same way we do. We don't hold exactly the same beliefs, we don't have the same experience of God, and we don't live out our discipleship of Jesus in the same way. But somehow we manage to sit down together and sing the same hymns and say the same prayers and receive the same body and blood in the bread and cup of Holy Communion. We allow God to form us into one community despite our differences.

And I believe we are better and stronger people of faith, and better and stronger churches, because of it. I know it's not all sunshine and roses, though. It is *hard* to live with those with whom you may profoundly disagree. It takes work, patience, and forgiveness. It requires learning how to stand firm in your own convictions while respecting others. But because we put in the hard work, we are living examples of a better way for the rest of our nation and the rest of our world. We don't have to put anyone through a litmus test of belief or affiliation, because we know that at God's table all have a place. We don't have to dismiss someone because they disagree with us, because we understand that difference is an inherent part of God's creation. We don't have to storm off or kick someone out because a mistake has been made, because we know God calls us to forgiveness and reconciliation. This is the way of life Jesus modeled for us, and it's the way we strive to follow as his disciples.

When we don't have to focus so much on all of that, it frees up a lot of energy to focus on the many things we do have in common: The love of God poured out freely for each of us. The sacred story of scripture (which, by the way, doesn't endorse *any* modern political party). The Gospel's clear call to love and serve our neighbors. The love we each have for our families, friends, and community. Our need for care in the difficult moments of life, and our need to celebrate when we experience joy, and the way we can support one another in both of these times.

There is a common saying about the autumn season that goes something like, "Fall teaches us how beautiful it is to let things go." Perhaps as the leaves change to shades of red and gold around us and the trees let go, we can let go of a few things too. Maybe we can leave assumptions about one another or our world at the church doors on Sunday, and enter the holy mystery into which God invites us.


