

Dear Friends in Christ,

Have you ever thought of your relationship with God...as a dance?

Come, join the dance of Trinity, before all worlds begun the interweaving of the Three, the Father, Spirit, Son. The universe of space and time did not arise by chance, but as the Three, in love and hope, made room within their dance.

We sang this hymn on Holy Trinity Sunday back in June as we considered the mystery of how God is at once three distinctly separate powers and yet one Divinity.

We even got out of our pews and DANCED, didn't we?! You never know what you might miss when you miss worship....

Our language describes the mystery of Trinity imperfectly, but the image of dance is a captivating one for me. It communicates the MOVEMENT that happens as part of God's person, and the RE-LATIONSHIP both between us and God, and also within God's self.

Through the act of creation and through the work of the Spirit anew each day, God moves aside to incorporate us into the dance, the joy, the holy work. As people of faith, we know well this joy of being a part of the divine dance. We know what it means to have had God waltz with us through the good times in life and to take our hand and lead us to a slower tune in times of grief or pain. We know what it is to have been accompanied in a way that is freeing and flowing, strong and persistent, gentle and grace-filled.

So, the question becomes—how do we as people of faith make room in the dance for others? How do we step aside to bring others into the joy? Where can we move aside for the sake of God's continuous new creation?

Who is missing from our Sunday worship? Kids and families? Young adults? People from the neighborhood around our churches? Who else? How might we make worship a more inviting space for newcomers?

What friend or family member might be searching for a spiritual connection? Can you invite them to worship with you, to volunteer at our blessing bag distribution July 19, to bible study in the fall?



Whoever would have imagined that a fine Italian gentleman has such deep ties to Sweden. Our very own Mike Iavagnilio has not one, but two sets of relatives that were first members of Augustana. Mr. and Mrs. C. A. Johanson and Mr. and Mrs. A. F. Johanson.

The first on the list are Mike's Great Grandparents. Karl August (Johannisson) and Johannas Marie (Andersdotter) who married in 1865 before immigrating from Sweden in 1871. They had a son, Johannes August Frithiof, and a daughter, Emma Christine. Emma Christina married Andrew Magnuson.

The second members of Augustana were Mike's Grandparents, August F. and Ida Marie Johanson, who had 13 children. Four of those children died in one year from an epidemic. Three of A. F. Johanson's boys served in WW II, but son, Paul, worked for the railroad as did his father. One of the daughters was Alice Helena who died giving birth.

Alice Helena died giving birth to Mike's mother, Betty. Many of you would remember Betty Kurtz Iavagnilio. She was a longtime member but attended Augustana only after her husband passed.

2025 Indiana-Kentucky Synod Assembly Report Faith, Hope, and Love

Bishop Tim Graham was the keynote all three days, speaking on Faith, Hope, and Love.

Our itinerary:

Thursday: First Plenary session, Welcome Dinner, Keynote with Bishop Tim, Gathering Worship Service

Friday: Morning Prayer/Devotional, Plenary session, Keynote with Bishop Tim, first of two breakout sessions. I went to "E-connect -A Transformational Journey for your Congregation" session regarding "congregations rediscovering their purpose, energizing their ministries, and deepening their connection with God, each other, and their communities." Emily Moyer attended "Getting to Know your Community" where attendees learned how to use available public data to be more informed about the community that lives in the immediate vicinity around your church and ways to reach them . Plenary session continued after break outs with synod vice president candidate Q&A, election and results, Synod reports (financial, et al), floor motions and discussion (lots of discussion)

Second breakout session. I attended the session regarding IN/KY synod disaster response, Emily Moyer attended the breakout regarding "De-Stigmatizing Addiction and Recovery in Congregations." (She received training for the use of Narcan!) Nice Q&A with Bishop Tim to end the evening.

Saturday: Morning Prayer/Devotional, Plenary session, Keynote with Bishop Tim, adoption of budgets (with discussion), remaining elections, and resolutions (with discussion), sending worship service with installation of new synod officers.

I didn't know what to expect at my first assembly, but I guess it went about the way I expected. I do bring back greetings and well wishes from Pr. Dan Forehand and Pr. Amy Beitelschees-Albers. It was also nice to spend more time getting to know Pr. Emily and the delegates from Grace. Lots of people, lots of listening, good fellowship, meaningful worship together, good sessions to dive a little deeper into something that spoke to you, lots of listening....

Two things stuck with me the most:

1. At the e-connect breakout, the administrator of the session reminded all of us in attendance that " You (Augustana) are enough. You (Augustana) already have all the tools and gifts you need."

2. And Bishop Tim, (having to re-write/re-work his keynote a little for Saturday after The Pacers NBA Finals Game 1 win) reminded all of us that it really is one simple thing –

"The mission is to tell the story."
