God's Gifts Pantry Update: With summer here, I felt it was time to give an update about the people we are helping. The number is growing! **June 11 we had 28 visitors, 117 fed. June 25 we had 40 visitors, 147 fed.** All we ask is how many are in their household. We are blessed being able to visit the Milford Food Bank. We purchase items there for 5 cents a pound. The average that we bring back is 600 lbs! Gyntown Food Bank in Elkhart is another resource. They carry different items and our cost is nothing. With cash donations, other items are purchased. Each month in our newsletter, we have a shopping list of items we need. Please refer to that. Dollar General has a great aisle of items that are only \$1! A few items that we run out of include toilet paper, feminine hygiene products, and Ensure type drinks. We can always use 8 oz packages of shredded cheese, light bulbs, and manual can openers. If you have household items you think someone might need, give me a call.

I can't forget to mention a few angels in the neighborhood who donate items. Two of them sale shop and drop off their finds, another knits hats in the winter and dish cloths now. She sits with her bedridden husband watching TV – it gives her something to do.

Thank you to our Augustana family for your continued support of our pantry. – Janet

Welcome to our year of listening!

At Augustana Lutheran Church we have begun a year of listening stretching from May 2026 to May 2027. During this year we are taking intentional time to listen more closely to the voices of God, one another, and our neighbors.

In worship, this means spending time in quiet as we begin to center ourselves and prepare to listen for God's voice. We will start with song, sit in silence, then be called to worship by the singing bowl (an instrument of prayer and meditation). Of course, during this time we anticipate some noise and wiggling from little ones. This is not a problem. We know that some are more comfortable with silence than others, and this experience will stretch all of us. If you need guidance to begin, consider placing both feet firmly on the floor, gently closing your eyes, and taking long, deep breaths. You may also choose a word (such as a name for God) to return to during the time of quiet whenever your mind begins to wander to other things.

GOSPEL – Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

In Matthew's gospel, both Jesus and his disciples "sow the seed" of God's word by proclaiming the good news that "the kingdom of heaven is near." Now, in a memorable parable, Jesus explains why this good news produces different results in those who hear.

A sower went out to sow. ⁴ And as he sowed, some seeds fell on a path, and the birds came and ate them up. ⁵ Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. ⁶ But when the sun rose, they were scorched, and since they had no root, they withered away. ⁷ Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. ⁸ Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. ⁹ If you have ears, hear!"

¹⁸ "Hear, then, the parable of the sower. ¹⁹ When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what is sown in the heart; this is what was sown on the path. ²⁰ As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy, ²¹ yet such a person has no root but endures only for a while, and when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, that person immediately falls away. ²² As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of this age and the lure of wealth choke the word, and it yields nothing.

²³ But as for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty.”

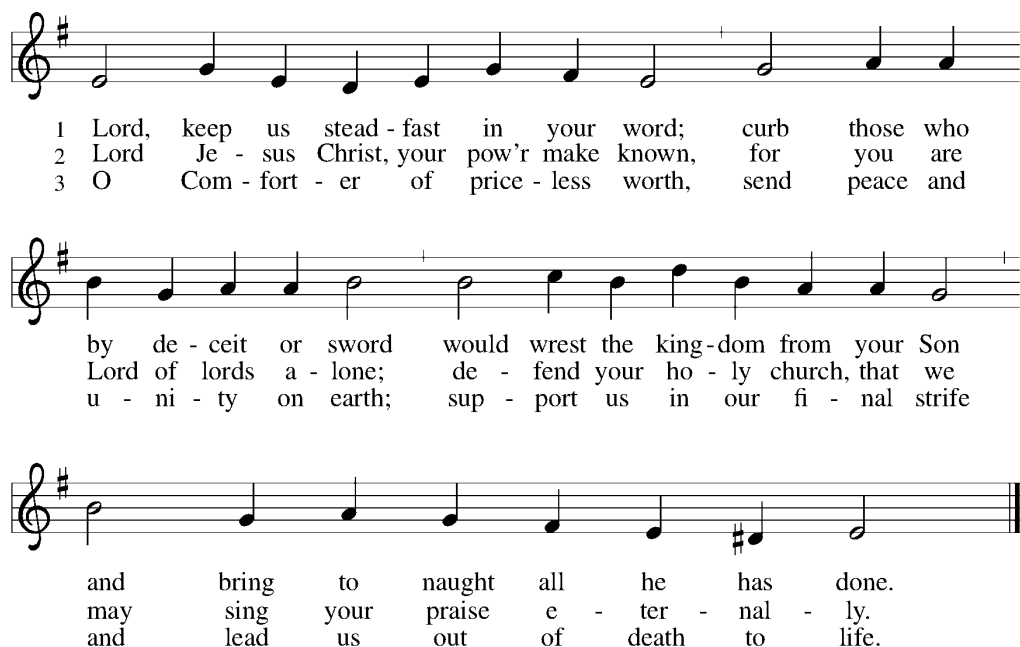
