



Doherty Church Windows To Visit

St. William Catholic Church was built in 1948 in Lone, Oregon on land donated by Garland Swanson, and officially dedicated on May 25, 1949 by Bishop Fahey. It was named St. William in honor of William Flannery and William (W.T.) Doherty.

A generous contribution of \$5,000 was donated for construction by the Catholic Church Extension Society in Mr. Flannery's memory.

Mr. Doherty passed away as a result of an injury sustained during the excavation of the new church's basement. A stained glass window was placed in the church in memory of Mr. Doherty.



BP Doherty was a resident of both his Sand Hollow Ranch near Alpine and Pendleton where he had at least 2 homes. One was "The Grove" on the west end of town. The other was in the east end near St. Mary's church, St. Anthony's Hospital and St. Joseph's Academy. Catholic education was important to Barney and Kate. They were married in 1895 in the original St. Mary's and with prosperity and a large family were able to gift a window to the present church in 1916.

St. Mary's Church is located at 800 SE Court Street in Pendleton.
