This is a non-credit course, an application is required and students must submit unofficial transcripts and full PSAT report including raw scores and percentiles. Courses are taught by university teaching staff. This is for students going into grades 10-12 next year, located at University of Houston or Rice, application deadline is May 4, 2018. Courses offered include Architecture (UH), Film (UH), Art History Appreciation (UH), Theatre (Rice), Fiction (UH), and Nonfiction (UH). Financial scholarships are available.
