PEDESTRIAN & VEHICLE SAFETY

PHASE 1 - Bus Stop Safety

- HHVCA letter drafted; requests Supervisor Storck take immediate action to install Stop signs at Bainbridge/Shenandoah & Karl/Shenandoah
- Request FCPDP provide auxiliary officers to perform bus stop duties

PHASE 2 - Neighborhood-wide Safety Improvements

- Solicit opinions from the community. *Need community involvement to strengthen our position*
- HHVCA letter to State/County requesting specific actions in specific areas
- Begin letter writing campaign to decision-makers
- Develop & distribute education component including non emergency numbers to report speeding and running of stop signs
- Self-Help
 - Encourage HHV residents to trim/remove vegetation on their property and adjacent right -of ways obstructing traffic signs. Get neighbors permission if obstruction is on their property
 - Engage neighbors to identify and report obstructed traffic signs

PAUL SPRING RESTORATION

- Project work from Mason Hill to Collingwood Roads; most work borders HHV
- County briefed at HHVCA June 2021 meeting; HHVCA questions/County responses on HHVCA website
- Project in pre-concept/design stage; paper documents available at Sherwood Library; digital documents on HHVCA website
- HHV Team formed to engage with County; met with County on August 9 for overview/ and to communicate our initial concerns, i. e. protect existing wildlife, extent of tree removal, construction disruption, upgrades for citizen use,
- County needs easements to start project & estimates 6 months (from early August) to obtain; inability to obtain may stall project
- Important to engage with County to ensure HHV equities are included in project
