

Hollin Hall Village Citizens Association (HHVCA)

Meeting Minutes

21 September 2021

The meeting was called to order by Leo Milanowski, HHVCA President, at 7:00 PM on ZOOM. There were approximately 15 people in attendance, including board and committee members.

Treasurer's Report

The HHVCA budget was presented and no concerns were reported.

Committees

Leo Milanowski noted that the Neighborhood Watch needs a chairperson.

Environment and Recreation

Dorothy Keough reported that planning for the Paul Spring Restoration project is still moving along and residents can submit comments into the conceptual design of the plan. If funded, the project would begin in 2024 and take 1 year to complete. Karl Road in Hollin Hall would be impacted. There are also calls for hiking trails along the stream. Neighboring communities are concerned about the construction.

Planning and Zoning

Don Martin reported the following:

- In Gum Springs, there is a proposal for an affordable housing site.
- In Spring Banks, there is a proposal to move the firehouse and build a homeless shelter.
- The Church on the corner of Ft. Hunt Road and Belle View Blvd. was sold and 7 houses will be built.
- Apartments near the Huntington metro are changing into condos

Additional Business

Pedestrian and Vehicle Safety

Ryan Battle provided a status update on the effort to improve traffic and pedestrian safety in Hollin Hall. While looking at a comprehensive plan, the first step would be to send a letter to Dan Stork to address concerns about Shenandoah Road, Wellington Road, and Paul Spring.

Business Promotion and Acts of Service

Jen Hanks continues to promote community acts of service and is soliciting ideas. HHVCA is also considering promoting local businesses to help the business owners in our community and possibly generate revenue.
