Confession and Forgiveness

Leader: Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, alive in the world, reviving creation, arriving soon. **Congregation: Amen.**

L: Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another. (silence for reflection)

L: God of mercy, C: we confess that we have sinned. We trust earthly powers and human authority alone. We grow fearful. We cling to false comforts.

L: God of might, C: we confess that we have sinned. We have turned away from our neighbors. We have trusted false promises.

L: God in our midst, C: we confess that we have sinned. We plead: come to us. Bring your mercy to birth in us.

L: A righteous branch springs forth: it is Christ the Lord, our Savior, in whom we have forgiveness, life and mercy. By the power of the Holy Spirit, receive the grace and forgiveness of God through + Christ Jesus, whose day draws near. **C: Amen.**

Lighting the First Advent Candle

L: Praise to you, O God, our salvation who is near. You hold us in our waiting and keep us awake to the world. You show up in our lives at unexpected times. Bless us as we light this candle to keep vigil for your arrival. We trust that even though we do not know the day or the hour, you hurry to gather all people to your peace. C: Amen.

Greeting — L: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. C: And also with you.

Prayer of the Day — Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come.
