## A Note from Pastor Amanda

There's a famous 3-minute sermon by Pastor S.M. Lockridge about the failings and fear and despair and death of Good Friday with the hopeful refrain: "It's Friday... but Sunday's comin'." If you haven't heard it – go find it, I'll wait.

I think the power of his message is that it acknowledges the brokenness of failing and fear and despair and death; but doesn't let the story end there. The story never ends there. God's salvation is always comin'.

How well do you pay attention to the work God is doing in your own life?
Where do you need to hear:
"Sunday's comin"?

It takes practice – spiritual practice – to listen to God. It takes time and effort to stop all the other things and pay attention to God's way of doing things. Like I've been saying at our Wednesday Lenten conversations, living in faith takes intentionality. With the Spirit's power, we've got to make choices to go deeper.

That's my sabbatical theme: **Go Deeper.** Here's how it will work:

For my Educational component, I hope to go deeper into preaching, exploring other ideas for study and delivery and participation. I'll be attending the Festival of Homiletics in St. Paul May 13-19. I'll be reading "Mighty Stories, Dangerous Rituals" by Anderson and Foley to fuel my preaching imagination.

For my <u>Spiritual Renewal component</u>, I will go deeper into ancient spiritual practices. I've applied to be part of a group

of 19 clergy for an 11-day Spiritual Renewal Retreat at Holy Wisdom Monastery in June. That time will revolve around praying the hours, holy silence, community discernment, service and work, and contemplative prayer. I'll be reading "The 7 Habits of Jesus" by Schmalzle to pattern my life after Christ's habits.

For my Restoration component (throughout the 10 weeks), I'm diving into things that feed my soul. I'll be camping with my family, taking voice and/or piano lessons, reading books for fun, and decluttering my house. I'll also be writing more with plans to start a blog. I'll also be reading "Where God meets Man" by Forde (FUR-dee), going deeper into Lutheran tradition that breathes God into our Monday through Saturday lives.

It's this final book I'd like you to read with me. It's not an afternoon kind of read – it will challenge you to go deeper into what you believe about God's relationship with us, what the cross teaches us, how baptism and communion feed us, and what our role is as people of faith. When I come back, we'll talk about it, study it together, Go Deeper as a congregation!

This is "Sunday" stuff for me – hope and life and transformation. I pray, with my whole spirit, that Sunday is comin' for you

Every Wednesday, Lord of Life serves as a distribution point for the Fairbanks Community Food Bank. Volunteers and office staff process calls and check IDs, cart tables outside and back in again, sort dozens of food boxes, and help people carry it all to their cars. Do we get anything else done on these days? Sometimes, not a lot! But it's an honor to support the Food Bank's efforts. We feel blessed to meet wonderful folks who are truly thankful. "First-timers" are speechless to see how much food they receive.

The Food Bank doesn't have what anyone would consider a great business plan. They get free food and then give it away. Plus, they have to pay for a warehouse and utilities, staff, and delivery vehicles. Yet they've been making it work for 37 years now, thanks to the generosity of the community we live in. Their vision:

- To have no one in the Tanana Valley die of starvation
- To have no Tanana Valley child go hungry
- To provide emergency food assistance to all who meet federal poverty guidelines

# **Council Highlights**

Bible study: God's Word is good for keeping you connected to God. Read Philippians over the next month.

<u>Upcoming events:</u> Clean up Day, April 28th. "Welcome to Mission", Sunday, May 5th. 5K Walk for Charity, May 10th. Confirmation Sunday, May 12th, (Mother's Day). Pastor Amanda's sabbatical leave begins Monday, May 13th.



- President's report: Pastor Dan Bollerud will be invited to write the May newsletter article and be introduced his first Sunday, May 19.
- Treasurer's report: Undesignated checking: \$ 4,037.22, Designated Checking: \$ 13,505.71. Debit Card checking: \$ 2,642.91, Savings: \$ 6,586.74. We are not meeting budget and are dipping into savings.
- Pastor's report: The church website has been redesigned! 26 people attended the youth retreat to Valdez, 19 of them from Fairbanks/North Pole. A meeting will be held with local pastors to discuss holding Good Friday worship at Lord of Life. Sabbatical plan was presented, will be in the April newsletter for all to see.
- Facilities: Jered Dulany signed up Lord of Life for a heating maintenance agreement, which will save potential after hours call out fees.
- Mission & Social Ministry report: Evie Freeman will coordinate volunteers to assist with the clothing drive at North Pole Baptist church.
- Worship & Music report: Curt Renner will investigate the feasibility of installing a system linking Bluetooth
  to hearing aids that filters out extraneous sound. Due to recent violence in worship spaces, safety and
  evacuation procedures will be looked into and become part of usher training.

New business: Scheduled a Church Garage Sale fundraiser for May 31—June 1 to help fund the septic repairs. A youth group mission trip from Two Harbors, MN will stay overnight July 27.

## Alaska Synod Assembly Meeting, April 26-28, 2019

Synod Assembly is a time for us to gather, celebrate, share, discuss, and pray as we continue to journey together as the Body of Christ in the Alaska Synod. This year the Assembly meets Friday, April 26 through Sunday, April 28, and will be hosted at Lutheran Church of Hope in Anchorage.

For many across the state, this is the largest worship gathering we attend all year.

This year we're digging into communication and community. Lori Draper of the Peace Alliance will teach non-violent communication strategies. We will address small conflicts like how to talk to our 90-year-old neighbor who still climbs on his roof, and big conflicts like the polarization of our nation. Our theme hymn: Neither Death nor Life, from Evangelical Lutheran Worship #622

Prairie Rose Seminole, Director of ELCA American Indian/Alaska Native ministries will represent our ELCA Churchwide body.

The weekend will be filled with these discussions and greetings, workshops about communicating, approving a synod budget based on congregation support, and addressing any resolutions brought forward. We close with worship at Lutheran Church of Hope or with other Anchorage-area churches.

#### "Next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise" - Martin Luther



Certain hymns hold deep meaning, regardless of theological accuracy or how musically well-written they are. It falls to pastors and church musicians to decide what will be sung in worship. Ideally, familiar hymns and songs will be balanced with new music, while remaining faithful to the lectionary. The older and well-known with newer; simple with complex; a variety of musical genres which are both comfortable and *challenging*.

Questions to ask when selecting hymns:

- What is the theme of the day? A sermon theme helps to identify an appropriate hymn response. Perhaps there is a church anniversary or a crisis in the community or world; events can dictate changes in the musical menu
- What liturgical actions are taking place? Worship planners can avoid picking a hymn that they end up wishing they could have used later when it was more "on point."
- What is the function of each hymn in worship? What is sung matters, but when it is sung does too.

What we sing changes us, through both text and the music—especially when they are married well. What is offered as assembly song must reflect God and His work through Jesus Christ. What we choose matters. If this makes sense to you, consider choosing hymns and songs during pastor Amanda's sabbatical. Talk to her for more information and a little training!

## Kuwaa Update A condensed version

Jenny Cosgrove and Stan Olsen just returned from Liberia, where programs are doing well and making a positive impact. This year they conducted a joint Bible/Koran School in Lowoma with stories common to the Old Testament and the Koran. 150+ children attended and had a great time. Rev. Paye told a very animated story of David and Goliath and the local Muslim leader told about Moses and Pharaoh.

Over 100 reusable sanitary napkin kits were distributed to girls in three villages in the Days to Girls program. The girls asked good questions and were excited to get the kits. If they take care of them and wash them properly the kits should last each girl 3-4 years. We are the first NGO to bring this program to Liberia and it has proved very popular. We also presented the program to Phebe and Curran Nursing Schools; they hope to include this program into their nursing curriculum and have students take it into the villages.

3 hand dug wells are being installed in the villages of Balama, Konjade and Teglei and wells are being repaired in three more villages. A contractor was hired to "hand drill" a well in Fassama; he drilled two 80' holes for consistent water flow. These deep wells shouldn't run dry in the dry season.

The "Big Belly" program teaches pregnant women about changes in their body, fetal development, proper nutrition and how to care for themselves and the baby, and encourages fathers' involvement.

Future projects include renovating aging schools and churches. It is hoped to have congregations "adopt" a facility to cover repairs and ongoing costs.
