A Note from Pastor Amanda

When is the last time you thought about what God is doing in your life?

We often think of our faith in little moments like an inspiring Sunday morning, an answer to prayer, a sense peace in a time of chaos. How often have you taken time to reflect on how these little moments connect to a bigger picture of God's work in your life?

Growing up, my church invited people of all ages to share their faith stories in the church season of Lent (in the spring). I'd listen to people talk how God guided them through job changes, illness, raising kids, the end of a marriage, and even death of a loved one.

Not having experienced these things, it took me a while to realize I had my own faith story to share. It took someone asking me a few questions to help me see that God was already present in my life.

Start by thinking through some of the key events of your life, positive and painful alike. (Feel free to make a timeline, journal, create art as you do this!) How did God use those events to shift or strengthen the direction of your life?

Have you been surprised that you've made it through a difficult situation? Who did God put in your path to encourage you?

When have you felt like God was enabling you to use your gifts to bless someone else?

When has forgiveness been a hard path, and what brought you wholeness after being hurt?

When have you created a new thing, idea, event, artwork, writing, etc? How was God involved?


How have your experiences and wisdom helped you support someone else in their struggles?

Where (in time or place) have you felt God's presence very close to you? What does that feel like for you?

Once you've spent some time with these questions, ask yourself if there's anything happening now that echoes in your history. How does God's work in your past help you find comfort, direction, or strength for today?

You have a story of God's faithfulness and love, of God's sometimes heavy hand that guides you, of God's comfort and strength in your life. And that story is still being written. Thanks be to God!

Outdoor Worship Service

1. Arrive early. Those wishing to stay in their vehicles park in the front row / handicap parking spaces. Others may settle on the front lawn 6 feet away from others.
2. Wear a mask until worship begins. Use the bathroom at home before coming. Please keep physical distance.
3. Bulletins, devotion books, Communion cups, and an offering basket will be on an entrance table and passed out by ushers.
4. Pray for sunshine! In case of rain, you may choose to stay in your car OR sit with an umbrella!

Council Highlights

Book Study: Ch. 6 of The Invitational Christian. "Give Them Tools." Reach out to others. Website that offers clear, current information. Business cards to hand out would be a great start. Next month, Ch. 7, "The Importance of With."

Treasurer's report: Undesignated checking: \$22,328.03 (of which, \$4,969.75 is what remains of the Payroll Protection Program Grant); Designated Checking: \$6,757.50; Debit Card checking: \$365.49; Savings: \$5,095.29. ELCA benevolence of \$855.80, WELCA of \$30, and electric and internet have been paid. Payroll is covered. Youth balance of \$4,088.48 will be used for the big youth gathering in MN.

Pastor's report: Between in-person attendance and YouTube and Facebook views, total worship attendance is ~80. Monday morning Bible Study has resumed. A driveway wedding was performed for a North Pole couple. Current projects: Policy and constitution updates; sanctuary capacity, parameters for returning to indoor worship; mitigation and phasing plans. Future projects: A tree donation, confirmation/fall education options, updating the membership book and clearing files.

Ongoing Business: Worship— We will stay outdoors as long as possible; the longer we can stay outside, the more people we can have participate. By September we may have to look at inside options. Inside worship will change drastically. Families without online capability are provided a DVD of the service by request. Alaska Synod Bishop, Shelley Wickstrom will preach on Aug. 16.

New Business: July birthdays and anniversaries. Proposed Bylaws and Policies & Procedures: Congregation Meeting Call-in Procedures presented. Policies passed: Debit card, Money handling, Maternity/Paternity and Adoption, and Sabbatical leave.

Building use request: An educational daytime children's cooking class, a for-profit endeavor. More information will be requested.

Possibly do a Wednesday event for The Underground as it's hard to get them together in the summer.

Facilities Report: Tim Schackman wants to clear more brush and will work on it.

Education Report: Nancy Uptgraft proposes bringing children downstairs for Sunday school activities and returning during communion, two Sundays per month. Discuss next meeting.
