

A Note from Pastor Amanda

Advent is like an airport. (You all remember airports, right?) It is one of those in-between spaces that we have to pass through before we get where we're going. Time itself seems to drag on while we wait for what's next; the anticipation makes us restless and irritable. We find that the waiting space can either sap our momentum or energize us to do something new.

Every non-pandemic December gets filled up with to-do lists and package mailing deadlines, deep-cleaning and meal planning, parties and cookie exchanges. Yet everything is different this year as we are all asked to sacrifice. So maybe this year, in the waiting place of pandemic, we can truly experience the patient and persistent hope of Advent.

While our pandemic is not the same as the exile that God's people experienced, the words from Isaiah still speak hope into our situation. "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." (Isaiah 43:18-19)

That's what this month before Christmas is about – waiting for signs of God's promises coming true, fighting against despair, fixing our focus, all while trusting God is present and salvation is near. Our job is to pause and listen for the ways God is doing new things within and around us. This Advent season, I invite you to listen and reflect on what it is to WAIT. A dear colleague formerly of Juneau, Pastor Suellen Bahleda, has put together reflection words for each day of Advent around the word WAIT. Where have you found wonder or anguish, time to inhale or amid a tempest?

I invite you to print pages 5 and 6 of this newsletter, cut along the dotted line, and toss the paper strips into a bowl. Each day beginning November 29, grab a new strip and reflect on how you have lived in the waiting place those words name. Let these words guide you through your day, in your prayers, to spark conversation with loved ones, or help you name what is happening in your own life. Sundays will be a time to give thanks for these waiting places, knowing God is with us in them.

Our Wednesdays will be a time to gather on Zoom for Advent Worship, listen to Holden Evening Prayer, imagine new traditions, grieve traditions on hold, and trust God through this in-between season in our lives.

Wishing you peace in your Advent waiting, and a joyous Christmas. May you have eyes and hearts that perceive the ways God is bringing out something new in our waiting spaces.



In-Person Worship Parameters

We are watching the 14-day average case rate at: http://dhss.alaska.gov/dph/Epi/id/Pages/COVID-19/alertlevels.aspx and making preparations with hope for gathering in person. Council passed a new mitigation plan that allows us to gather when the case rate is at 20 or below.

Greater than 21 case rate: worship will be online only, risk is too high

11-20 case rate: worship will be in person, masks required upon entry and during worship

5-10 case rate: worship will be in person, masks required upon entry, may be removed in worship

< 5 case rate: worship will be in person, masks are optional

Worship in person will also change in some significant ways. To lessen potential virus spread, we will refrain from singing, passing offering baskets, or coming forward for Communion. As the vaccine becomes widely administered, we will be able to get back to building our faith in community again!

Council Highlights

Bible Study: Revisit Ch. 2 of the Invitational Christian, "Why Should Anyone Come?" Our Work Matters to God. Discussed how being part of LoL has changed our lives, what ministries matter to us. Practiced ways we can invite others to join us in these meaningful ministries — not just "come to church."

Master Calendar and Goal Check: Engage youth and children: youth group is meeting twice monthly, more focused on playing together. Support for those in crisis: Cards still being sent. Evie Freeman and team has sent 200 masks to Central CA. Engage members in our mission: including women to help with masks.



Treasurer's report: Undesignated checking:

\$7,817.72; Designated Checking: \$6,812.49; Debit Card checking: \$774.56; Savings: \$8,199.49. Have not paid ELCA \$822.00 and \$96.97 Disaster Relief.

Pastor's report: Completed boundary training. GCI phones are changed over. Philippians study ended, no feedback. Had two last minute requests for weddings. Mentoring a Presbyterian seminarian. Coming up: Adopt-a-Family, Thanksgiving food boxes, Habakkuk study in November.

Ongoing Business:

- Loan/Grant, Final funds will go to heating fuel. Application for forgiveness is in progress.
- New equipment. Jason will craft instructions, then training for volunteers can begin.
- Dan and Missy Rees have donated beef, can start dropping off shares when we are ready. Sign up for 20 lbs for \$200, they can be picked up at the church when you've paid!
- We expect the broken window will be repaired within the month.

New Business:

- Safe Church Policy passed includes boundary training, guidelines for inappropriate contact reporting.
- Annual meeting went well online! Next year, add a microphone so those in the sanctuary can be heard and display information on TV screens.
- Amended gathering parameters: more than 21 case rate—online worship only. 11-20—in person worship, masks required. 5-10— masks required as we gather. <5— masks optional.
- Online communion. Will be done on "live" Sundays, not pre-recorded services, at pastor's discretion. Information will be sent to the congregation prior to Communion for study and reflection.
- Christmas program. Cancelled this year.
