
December 2022

The Story of "Hallelujah"

Leonard Cohen was known for timeless writing and poetry that float outside of any particular epoch. His hallmark track has captivated generations of listeners. While "Hallelujah" may sound like an old standard or a hymn passed down through the ages, it was written in 1983 using a humble Casio keyboard. Fun fact: Cohen wrote a staggering 180 verses for "Hallelujah." Adding to its drama are the original version's husky vocals, from Cohen's years of smoking. "Hallelujah" and the album it came from were rejected by Leonard Cohen's own record company because Columbia Records decided that "Hallelujah" didn't have the commercial cachet they sought. The song was eventually released by an independent label. It was widely ignored.

Oddly enough, the song's popularity can be traced to its inclusion in the soundtrack of *Shrek*, one of the highest grossing movies of 2001, which launched Hallelujah into the stratosphere. **There is no other song with a trajectory like "Hallelujah."**

"Hallelujah" was rejected by Cohen's label due to a lack of commercial appeal

Many view it as a Christian song. Interestingly, Cohen was Jewish. "The word Hallelujah appears across religions and faiths. People take what they need from [the song] and what they want it to be. I think that's why it's played everywhere from weddings to funerals and births," says Dan Geller, director of documentary Hallelujah: Leonard Cohen, A Journey, A Song.
