

A Note from Pastor Amanda

Synod Assembly Notes

This year focused on innovation in our style and practice of worship and in the future of the church. Faith stories included a church building in Chugiak that burned down and how they have become more deeply connected to the community. Churches shared their online worship knowledge and experiences to help improve.

Sam Aleshire attended a workshop on endowments for those who would like to include Lord of Life in their will.

Paula Fritsche attended a workshop on coaching for congregations and individuals, asking questions to get at the root of our motivation and clarify our goals.

Pastor Amanda attended a workshop on inviting people to interact as a community and keeping online groups connected.

Phishers of Men (not the good kind)


Congregations are being targeted by scammers and phishing attacks—sad but true! Emails or texts pretend to be from a pastor or bishop and ask for private conversation or a favor. Last year, the FBI reported that this is a \$26 billion scam. Lord of Life received such an email recently. How did we spot it? How can you?

- 1. Check the sending email address/phone number. Attackers create addresses with the real name but use a fake email, often from gmail or yahoo accounts. Text scammers use local area codes, claiming it's a new phone number. These emails often contain misspellings, strange punctuation, or grammar that is slightly "off". Know that Pastor Amanda will never contact you via email or text asking for money.
- AWARNING PHISHING SCAM
- 2. Look for red flags in tone and grammar. Attackers want to create a sense of urgency, to prey on our natural desire to help. They may claim the pastor needs something and is in a meeting. Or needs to urgently have a private conversation.
- 3. These scams often ask for the purchase of gift cards or want you to provide information (for more scams). Requested help purchasing \$300 Amazon Apple e-gift card for a friend because "they are having issues charging my card" and it was a friend's birthday (see sense of urgency, #2). We would of course be reimbursed.

If an email or text seems 'off' have someone else read it and get their opinion. Contact the church or synod office to confirm the email address or phone number of the sender.

Council Highlights

Bible Study: Led by Pastor Amanda. Isaiah 58:13-59:1. For what impossible situation is God inviting you to have greater faith?

Treasurer's report: Undesignated checking: \$13,239.44; Designated Checking: \$8,463.47; Debit Card checking: \$1,027.70; Savings: \$16,462.35. NP Cares funding is used up and expenses are now being covered by offering. April had three pay periods.

Pastor's report:

- Worship participation—average attendance was 70.75. Community giving—201 Farm to Table boxes over 3 weeks. Lord of Life is considering taking over both orders and distribution for Tuesday food boxes. We are a distribution site for Tuesdays/Wednesdays. We received a donation for a new projection computer that should fix issues. A gaming computer at Costco costs \$1250 and should be enough for our needs. Youth helped prepare NPHS grad gifts (worry stone, prayer card, and sticker).
- June worship planning—getting things together for outdoor worship. Will have a retreat this summer to build the bond for the 2022 Youth Gathering in Minneapolis. Vacation scheduled 5/20-6/3.

 2021 Goal Check:
- Discover/tell faith stories. Hymn suggestion in memory/honor of people. Will ask people to write prayers. Dedicate time for faith stories.
- Launch easy signup & serve program. Liz sent out a test signup and it went well.
- Complete Gift Inventory for the congregation. Amanda is researching.
- Strengthen members' connection. Facebook continues strong. In person and online worship.
- Engage people in worship. Amanda is planning the first few weeks; Curt headed up planning teams in prior months.

Ongoing Business: NP will not have a July 4th parade. Lord of Life will have VBS July 12-16. Outdoor worship begins June 13, with setup June 12. More benches, mosquito spraying, and fellowship.

New Business: Cards still being sent out. Will discuss in August whether we are ready to host Loving Families in person. Mitigation Plan-reviewed and updated the Mitigation Plan. Synod Assembly Report (see article, p. 2). We will hire someone to clean on Kevin's alternate weeks.
