Gathering p. 279

Leader: Welcome in the name of Jesus, the Savior of the world. We are gathered to worship, to proclaim Christ crucified and risen, to remember before God our brothers and sisters, to give thanks for their lives, to commend them to our merciful redeemer, and to comfort one another in grief.

Thanksgiving for Baptism

L: When we were baptized in Christ Jesus, we were baptized into his death. We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

Eternal God, maker of heaven and earth, who formed us from the dust of the earth, who by your death gave us life, we glorify you. Congregation: We glorify you.

L: Jesus Christ, the resurrection and the life, who suffered death for all humanity, who rose from the grave to open the way to eternal life, we praise you. C: We praise you.

L: Holy Spirit, author and giver of life, the comforter of all who sorrow, our sure confidence and everlasting hope, we worship you. C: We worship you.

L: To you, O blessed Trinity, be glory and honor, forever and ever. C: Amen.
