Districts: subdivisions within a Council










Safeguarding Youth in Pack 95



- Safeguarding our youth is our highest priority
 - All Pack 95 leaders are parents or grandparents of Cubs from our Pack
 - We are here to join our kids' scouting journey and to make sure they have fun, learn new skills, have great experiences, and do so in a safe and nurturing environment
 - One parent/guardian/designee is required to attend Pack 95 meetings with their Cub Scout(s)
- How we protect our Scouts
 - Scouts America vets leader applications: background check, reference checks, and screening list
 - Pack 95 obeys Two-Deep Leadership (no adult is ever alone with a child, with exception of their own)
 - Pack 95 requires all Scouts to use the Buddy System (no scout departs camp, events, or otherwise without a buddy from the pack)
- Online training resources: https://www.scouting.org/training/youth-protection/
- Safeguarding Youth Training is REQUIRED for
 - All adult leaders: ALL Pack 95 Leaders are Current with their certification
 - All parents/guardians joining Pack 95 campouts we require one trained parent/guardian with their scout(s) at every camp: online training requires creating a login ID
 - All youth as part of their yearly rank: training varies by rank and may be text- or video-based









The Cost of Running a Pack

Budget based on cost estimates an 40 scouts for upcoming year

Item	Cost	Description
Scout Advancements	\$1,100	patches, belt loops, and pins
Pack BSA Recharter Fees	\$1,216	BSA fees for pack and leader registration
Banquets and Special Events	\$375	supplies, crafts, decorations, snacks
Car Wash Supplies	\$100	soap, supplies, towels, food, water
Pack Website & PO Box	\$466	fees to providers, not Pack staff
Pack95 Orange T-shirts	\$400	estimate per year based on inventory
Pinewood Derby	\$300	car kits and awards
BSA Council Support	\$300	Friends of Scouting (in lieu of popcorn sales)
Summer Wave Pool	\$250	fees from city
Fall Recruiting Handouts	\$100	fees from printing provider
Contingency	\$400	unexpected costs (price increases or low fundraising)

Total: \$5007

Pack Cost per Scout (assuming 40 scouts): \$125

does not include cost of campouts, field trips, summer camp

2023-2024 program actual cost (~55 scouts): \$5901 2024-2025 program actual cost (~40 scouts): \$4677*

What does Cub Scouts Cost YOU?

- Scouting America Registration Fees to the national organization (does NOT go to our pack)
 - \$85 registration + \$9.18 (insurance + administrative fee) for one year (as of May 1, 2024)
 - optional \$15 ScoutLife annual subscription (also paid online)
 - Pay via scouting.org (click on "my.scouting" at the top right, create or log in with userID)
 - Further info at https://www.scouting.org/programs/cub-scouts/cost-of-cub-scouting/
- Cub Scout Uniform: cost varies based on selected items (link on upcoming chart)
- Pack Dues for our Pack 2025-2026 program year (not to the national organization)
 - \$125 per scout for the school year (the cost per scout to run our pack)
 - Option A: Pay the full amount of \$125 per scout and skip participation in fundraisers
 - Option B: Pay \$50 per scout and commit to work fundraisers (we need to fundraise \$1500+)
 - Not included: campouts or field trips
 - Paid via Venmo (See Pack Treasurer), pack website (https://pack95seabrook.org/ but adds ~4% vendor fee), check made to "Pack 95", or cash (in labeled envelope given to Pack Treasurer)

Uniforms

- Pack T-shirt (Class B Uniform)
 - New scouts receive one free shirt with initial dues
 - Returning scouts & families can purchase a shirt for \$12 each
