Units: packs/troops/crews






Cub Scouts Pack 95

Youth Protection and Pack 95



- Youth Protection is Our highest priority
 - All Pack 95 leaders are parents or grandparents of existing Cubs in our Pack
 - We are here to join our kids' scouting journey, and to make sure they have fun, learn new skills, have great experiences, and do so in a safe and nurturing environment
 - One parent/guardian/designee is required to attend Pack 95 meetings with their Cub Scout(s)
- How we protect our Scouts
 - ScoutsBSA vets leader applications: background check, reference checks, and screening list
 - Pack 95 obeys Two-Deep Leadership (no adult is ever alone with a child, with exception of their own)
 - Pack 95 requires all Scouts to use the Buddy System (no scout departs camp, events, or otherwise without a buddy from the pack)
- Youth Protect Training (YPT) is REQUIRED for
 - All adult leaders: ALL Pack 95 Leaders are Current with their YPT certification
 - All parents/guardians joining Pack 95 campouts we require one parent/guardian with scout(s) at camp: Youth Protection Training: online training link (requires creating a login ID)
 - All youth as part of their yearly rank: Youth Protection Guide (online) and with every Cub Rank Booklet













The Cost of Running a Pack

Targeted Budget

Item	Cost	Description
Scout Advancements	\$1950	patches, belt loops, and pins
Pack BSA Recharter Fees	\$850	BSA fees for pack and leader registration
Banquets and Special Events	\$500	supplies, crafts, decorations, snacks, pizza
Car Wash Supplies	\$500	soap, supplies, towels, food, water
Pack Website & PO Box	\$450	fees to providers, not Pack staff
Pack95 Orange T-shirts	\$400	estimate per year based on inventory
Pinewood Derby	\$400	car kits and awards
BSA Council Support	\$300	Friends of Scouting (in lieu of popcorn sales)
Summer Wave Pool	\$250	fees to city
Handouts Printing	\$200	fees to printer
Carryover	\$300	toward next program year
Contingency	\$300	unexpected costs (price increases or low fundraising)

Total: \$6600

Pack Cost per Scout (assuming 50 scouts): \$132

What does Cub Scouts Cost YOU?

- ScoutsBSA Registration Fees for the BSA organization (does not go to our pack)
 - BSA Fees: \$85 fee + \$6 insurance for one year (as of May 1, 2024)
 - optional \$15 ScoutLife annual subscription (also paid online)
 - Pay via scouting.org (click on "my.scouting" at the top right, create or log in with userID)
 - Further info at https://www.scouting.org/programs/cub-scouts/cost-of-cub-scouting/
- ScoutsBSA Cub Scout Uniform: cost varies based on selected items (link on upcoming chart)
- Pack Dues for our Pack 2024-2025 program year (not to the BSA organization): the cost of scouting \$132
 - Option A: Pay the full amount of \$132 per scout
 - Option B: Pay \$50 per scout and commit to work all necessary fundraisers for the remainder
 - Optional campouts or any special field trips are not included
 - Paid via Venmo (See Pack Treasurer), pack website (https://pack95seabrook.org/ but adds ~4% vendor fee), check made to "Pack 95", or cash (in labeled envelope given to Pack Treasurer)

 - Varies by grade: blue for K-4th, tan for 5th-12th grade
 - Ask patch specifics from your Den/Pack Leaders or website
 - We can email images of patch placement, and the Scout Shop will help you too!
- Pack T-shirt (Class B Uniform)
 - New scouts receive one free shirt with initial dues
 - Returning scouts & families can purchase a shirt for \$12 each










September Events
