

Homestead's performance on the Aspire fails to inspire

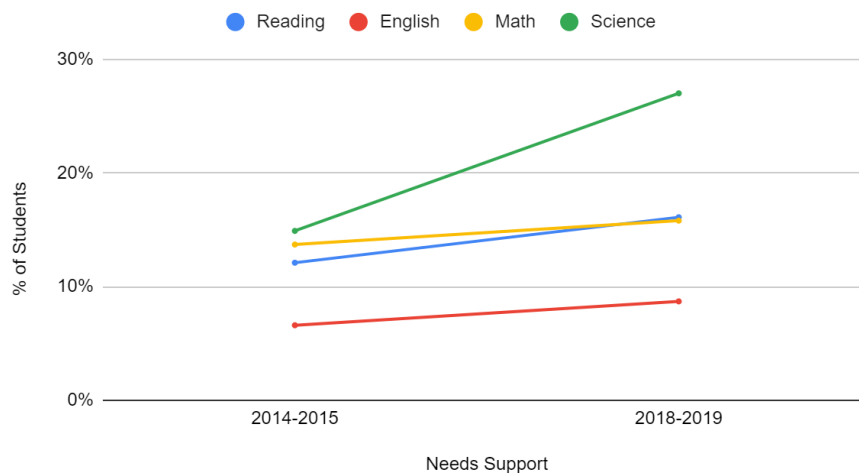
"The ACT Aspire® is a summative assessment that measures what students have learned in the areas of: English, reading, math, science and writing." (dpi.wi.gov/assessment/act/aspire)

Statewide, ninth and tenth graders take the ACT Aspire and results are published on the Department of Public Instruction's website (wisedash.dpi.wi.gov) for the school years 2014-2015 through 2018-2019. MTSD freshman and sophomores taking the ACT Aspire in 2014-2015 included 603 students, and in 2018-2019 included 633 students. Among the metrics provided by the assessment, the "Readiness Level" is available for the subject areas reading, English, math, and science.

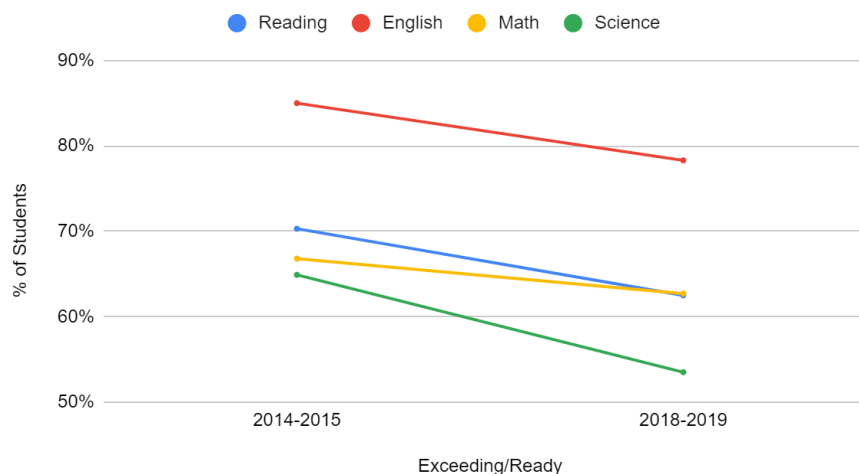
In all four subject areas, the percentage of students ranking as "needs support" increased.
