




### When describing human nature, we frequently refer to – IQ, Intelligence Quotient 智商


#### ... and EQ, Emotional Intelligence 情商


Emotional intelligence (EI), emotional leadership (EL), emotional quotient (EQ) and emotional intelligence quotient (EIQ), is the capability of individuals to recognize their own emotions and those of others, discern between different feelings and label them appropriately, use emotional information to guide thinking and behavior, and manage and/or adjust emotions to adapt to environments or achieve one's goal(s).[1][2]



The order of the animals on the zodiac was determined by who was the biggest, so how did the tiny Rat win the No. 1 spot?




All these findings struck me, it is this **Desire** (the urgent feeling in our gut, fundamentally sexual) that drives our life!
At various levels, our desire for sex, our desire for power, our desire for money...














#### Like IQ and EQ, we need a scoring system for DQ.





- This chart can be equally applied to sexual nature in women (Daniel Bergner - What do women want?: adventures in the science of female desire / 2013)








#### **DEI Model applied to life**











#### **DEI Model applied in business**






## DEI Model applied in workplaces

#### Questions and answers on the DEI model (and introduction of DQ)

Q: There is an EQ, why DQ?

A: Sexual desire in each one of us, as a driver in our life, needs to be openly called out

Q: What's the differences between EQ and DQ?

A: EQ, a dimension in describing human nature, is about cognition of emotions; while "Desire is the very essence of man (Baruch Spinoza)", need to be a dimension on its own.

Q: Why three dimensions, complicated?

A: Human, upon which life is built, is complicated. Again, like all objects in the nature, "three" makes a model definable, stable, and complete in a physical or imagined universe

Q: What's the purpose of defining DQ, or the DEI model?

A: By assessing (testing) a person's three dimensions, one gets to "Know thyself", accepts "you are who you are" (don't compare with someone else) – one will be a lot happier in life

# Seeking academic collaboration with the objective of establishing Desirous Quotient as a key measuring element of human nature –

#### Two potential approaches:

- **Top-down:** write a book to argue and establish DQ as an equal element of human nature as IQ and EQ, in which provide a methodology for scoring DQ;
- Bottom-up: set up a graduate study to quantitatively demonstrate (with a questionnaire to score) that DQ is indeed a key element of human nature. Suggested scope of the study
  - 1. Examine existing test scripts in personality tests, like Myers-Briggs, or "The Big Five personality traits", for questions that would suit better for DQ testing.
    - with partnership with the owning institutions of these tests
  - 2. Explore what additional questions we should have in order to construct more scientific measures on DQ?
    - with collaboration with psychologists/sociologists/statisticians
  - 3. Conduct interviews and/or study biographies of selected well-known people (in politics, business, sports, etc.), use the DQ questionnaire and score them on the DEI model with holp from individuals and historians.
