A New Year, A New and Familiar Mission: An Invitation for the Church to Reimagine As the calendar flips to a new year, I engage in the familiar ritual of reflecting on the past while starting to and setting intentions for the future. This year, I propose the Church embark on a similar journey, but with a deeper purpose: to redefine its mission and vision for the years to come. This will take place in the coming months as we ask the following questions of: "Who are we, Who were we and who do we see ourselves to be in the future" We will not simply be looking to update our goals; we will be actively seeking to understand who God is calling us to be in this community and how we can best fit the calling God has put on our hearts. The re-visioning process will involve a series of community gatherings, prayer sessions, and small group discussions. I will invite members of the congregation and participants in the church's current ministries to share their hopes, dreams, and concerns for the church's future. I believe the Second Congregational Church is at a pivotal moment in its journey as it plans the path of the future and for its people. To do this I believe we need all input from all walks of people. Like making maple syrup, there needs to be gallons of sap before a pint of syrup is realized. We will be collecting data (sap) from the whole community in the form of surveys, conversations and social gatherings. We will then have a select group to boil it down till we have the sweet syrup of a discerned plan for the church to sample and decide. I believe God's will is revealed through the collective wisdom and discernment of the people and we need a lot of participation from all of you. We will be learning the skill of intentional listening while seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit, so we can discern a clear path forward. We will have the opportunity to share in each other's stories as we celebrate, discern, and find our meaning in church. Some of the key questions the church will be exploring include: Who are we as a church? What are our core values and beliefs and how do our practices say this? What are our unique gifts, talents, and passions? How can we best utilize our gifts, graces, and passions to serve God and others? What are the greatest needs in our community? How do our gifts and graces address those needs in a meaningful way? What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus Christ in today's world? How can we develop and live out our faith with authenticity and impact? The outcome of this process will be a renewed mission statement and a refined vision for the future. This will help us in the church's decision-making, resource allocation, and ministry efforts in the years to come. I will be encouraging the Second Congregational Church to invite the entire community to join us on this exciting journey of faith and discovery. Whether they are a long-time member or a newcomer, every voice is valued and their participation is welcomed. I believe that this is a time of new beginnings for our church, and together, with the help of God we can build a vibrant community of faith that makes a real difference in our community and the world. The first study will kick off in February as we explore the book Vital Vintage Church by Michael Piazza and Take this Bread by Sarah Miles. 


