OUR IMPACT

Hope for a Better Future is dedicated to uplifting women and children in East Africa by meeting their essential needs and nurturing long-term well-being. Guided by a heartfelt commitment to these communities, our work empowers women and children to step into a brighter, more secure future. In 2024, we witnessed meaningful progress—real improvements in daily life that reflect the strength and resilience of those we support.

In 2023, the people of Mikameni village gained access to clean and reliable water—an essential step that made everyday life easier and healthier. Building on that progress, 2024 brought new opportunities for growth through expanded agricultural efforts, improving both food security and livelihoods.

One of the most meaningful impacts continues to be seen at the Mikameni preschool, Hope For Their Future. This vital program now prepares 80 children for a strong start in first grade. These children are thoughtfully selected by village leaders, as they are often left on their own while their parents work during the day or being raised by an elderly grandparent. Thanks to early education and nutritional support, these young learners are thriving—and when they graduate, they consistently stand out as some of the best-prepared students in their schools.

Our three SACCO community banks now empower 112 women, offering financial tools and support that help them build resilience and independence. In 2024, they faced significant challenges due to the global economic climate, which has hit Tanzania hard with rising costs of basic needs, food, and cooking gas. Despite these difficulties, we are grateful to be moving forward with strength and determination.



As we look ahead, we are filled with hope and anticipation for what 2025 and beyond will bring. The latter part of 2024 was dedicated to analyzing and researching the possibility of building a health dispensary to further support the well-being of the Mikameni village community. In collaboration with the local government in Moshi, we are proud to have received both approval and commitment to move forward. Together, we will begin implementation in 2025, guided by a carefully developed three-year plan.

Together, we will continue to support and uplift women and children in Tanzania, building a foundation for lasting change—step by step, and always with hope at heart.

Empowering Women Through Community-Led Finance

In 2024, our commitment to women's economic empowerment in Marangu continued to thrive through our SACCOS (Savings and Credit Co-Operative Societies). These community-led initiatives are designed to reduce poverty by equipping women with the tools and support needed to unlock their own potential and drive local economic growth.

Building on our strong foundation, we successfully launched our third SACCOS in 2023, now supporting 35 new members. Combined with our two existing groups—supporting 77 women—we now reach a total of 112 women who are actively participating in savings, credit, and business development opportunities.

Each SACCOS is governed by an elected board of peers, ensuring that leadership, growth, and accountability remain within the community. Thanks to these efforts, over 40 small businesses are now up and running in Marangu, directly generating income and independence for the women involved.

Types of businesses currently flourishing include:

- Tailoring services
- Livestock farming: goats, chickens, pigs, and cows
- Vegetable cultivation
- Hair salons
- Production of nutritious porridge powder

These ventures not only provide vital income but also build confidence, skills, and long-term stability for the women and their families. The ripple effect of these empowered entrepreneurs is already visible across the wider community, and we look forward to continued growth in 2025 and beyond.

Strengthening the Next Generation

Investing in early childhood development is one of the most effective ways to break the cycle of poverty. According to UNICEF, nearly half of Tanzania's children live in multidimensional poverty, lacking access to basic needs such as education, nutrition, and health services. Early support is essential to give these children a fair start in life and unlock their full potential.

At the heart of our mission is the Ghona School Project, a preschool located in Mikameni Village, in Tanzania's Kilimanjaro region. In 2024, the school continued to serve 80 children through a combined education and nutrition program designed to lay strong foundations for learning, health, and well-being.

Each child receives:

- One nutritious meal per day, essential in a region where food insecurity is common.
- Uniforms and warm sweaters, which not only create a sense of belonging but provide warmth-especially important as many children have no other warm clothing.
- Health assessments, with records kept to monitor each child's development, growth, and overall well-being.





Strengthening the Next Generation

To strengthen the nutritional value of school meals, the preschool also maintains its own chickens, which supply fresh eggs to boost the children's protein intake-supporting both cognitive development and physical growth.

These early years are critical, and through this program, children are entering primary school healthier, more prepared, and more confident. They are given the tools to thrive, and ultimately, to shape a stronger future for their families and communities.



Water project - Mikameni village

Access to clean water has long been a challenge in Mikameni village, home to our preschool and surrounding communities. In late 2021, a groundwater survey revealed a strong underground water source 180 meters deep—laying the foundation for a transformative water project.

- Phase 1 (2022): A borehole was drilled, a pump installed, and a 50,000-liter water tank constructed to provide safe water for health, hygiene, and agriculture.
- Phase 2 (2023): Seven water stations were installed throughout the village, improving daily access and supporting better health and local development.


By 2024, over 8,000 people–from Mikameni and nearby villages– now have reliable access to clean water. This access has also boosted local agriculture, with more households now able to grow crops year-round thanks to irrigation.

Looking ahead, Hope for a Better Future aims to build an additional water tank to serve neighbouring villages more directly and expand the impact of this vital resource.

Dispensary project

Background

After a long period of evaluation, successful fundraising, and strong collaboration with local government authorities, we are proud to share that Hope For A Better Future has received approval from the Moshi government to construct the dispensary in Mikameni Village. We have also signed contracts with contractors to commence construction, marking an important milestone in our mission to improve access to healthcare for this underserved community.

Tanzania is a resource-constrained country with a fragile healthcare system challenged by high maternal and child mortality rates, HIV/AIDS, pneumonia, malaria, and other preventable diseases. The country also has some of the world's lowest ratios of healthcare personnel to population.

In 2021/2022, we successfully installed a water tank system with seven main arteries delivering clean, reliable water throughout Mikameni Village. This project has significantly improved the daily lives of over 3,000 residents. Despite this progress, the village still lacks a nearby healthcare facility; residents must walk several kilometers to reach the Regional Hospital, and those most in need often go without care.

As a dedicated development partner, Hope For A Better Future aims to address this gap by funding the construction of a dispensary. The proposed facility will include an outpatient department, a reproductive and child health unit, and a maternity and delivery block on already acquired land.
