

Progress is Present. Potential is Everywhere.


Columbus City Schools (CCS) is not only making progress on several metrics in the latest Ohio Department of Education and Workforce (ODEW) Report Card, but also operates dozens of high-performing schools. A total of 40 CCS schools earned 3-Stars or better on the latest State Report Card, serving 17,985 students.

The Literacy Imperative: Ohio's Foundational Challenge



Crucial Context: Students who are not proficient in reading by third grade are 3x more likely than their proficient peers to not graduate on time.

Statewide, only 58.9% of fourth-grade students scored proficient or higher.

Our City, Our Students: A Tale of Two Trends



The CCS Board Goal is for the percentage of third-grade students proficient in Reading to increase from 34.5% in School Year 2022-2023 to 44.5% by June of 2028.

Understanding the Headwinds: Challenges in School and at Home



Early Literacy Gaps

The "Start Behind, Stay Behind" dynamic where students entering kindergarten academically behind their peers tend to remain behind.



Systemic Hurdles

Insufficient district infrastructure for implementing evidence-based practices and gaps in educator knowledge of foundational skills.

Our North Star: The Science of Reading



Align Resources Equitably


Will not allow any region to be without strong learning communities.




Ensure a Culturally-Responsive Staff

Will not allow cultural non-responsivity to impact student experience or staff effectiveness.



Post-Pandemic Academic Recovery Rate




A review of data from the State Report Card also shows that Columbus City Schools are improving at a faster rate than schools statewide since the COVID-19 pandemic in 11 of 14 key categories.



From Problem to Potential: The Power of Intervention

While only 37% of third-grade students on Reading Improvement and Monitoring Plans (RIMPs) scored proficient in the spring, the progress they make is significant.
