NOTICE OF COMMISSION OFFICE LOCATION
NOTICE to ELDERLY VOTERS OR VOTERS WITH DISABILITIES
COUNTY PRIMARY ELECTION MAY 5, 2026

Persons who are 60 years of age or older and voters with a disability and whose polling place is not accessible may choose to vote at the Election Commission Office on Election Day or by mail.

Voting at the Election Commission Office on Election Day

The voter may cast their ballot at the Trousdale County Election Commission office on Election Day between the hours of 7 am and 7 pm. Voters must file a one-time affidavit stating that their designated voting location is inaccessible and does not comply with the provisions of Public Law 98-435 at least 10 days prior to Election Day. It is NOT necessary to file a statement prior to every election. The next election will be the May 5, 2026, County Primary Election. The deadline to file this affidavit is April 25, 2026.

Voting by Absentee Ballot by Mail

Voting by mail requires a written request provided to the Trousdale County Election Commission. The last day for a request to vote by mail to be accepted by the Election Commission is April 25, 2026. For complete details regarding voting by mail, please call 615-374-2712.

Voting during the Early Voting Period

There will be no early voting period for the May election since none of the offices are contested.

Election Commission Office Location

The Election Commission Office is located at 200 East Main Street, Room 8, Hartsville, Tennessee, 37074. Phone number is 615-374-2712 and email address is tc1pvote@yahoo.com. Regular office hours are 7:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday. The office will be closed on federal and state holidays. Hours will be extended on Election Day. The last day to register to vote for the May 5th election is April 6, 2026. You may register to vote at the Trousdale County Election Commission, Tennessee Department of Motor Vehicle Driver Testing Centers, Tennessee Department of Human Services Offices, the Trousdale County Health Department or any other public assistance agency. Voters who register at the above locations will be considered "in-person" registrations. You may also pick up by-mail registration forms at the office of Register of Deeds, the office of County Clerk, Trousdale County High School library and the Public Library. Voters who register "by-mail" are required to vote in person the first time they vote. Voters who are already registered in Trousdale County may update their address or name by visiting the Election Commission Office, by sending in their voter registration card with corrections or by sending a written request over their signature. Voters who fail to make changes prior to Election Day will experience a delay in voting. Federal or Tennessee state government issued photo ID is required to vote, unless an exception applies. College student IDs will not be accepted. To learn more about the law and its exceptions, please call 615-374-2712 or visit GoVoteTN.com.
