NOTICE OF EARLY VOTING & ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL
PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE PRIMARY & COUNTY
REPUBLICAN PRIMARY MARCH 5, 2024

The Trousdale County Election Commission is hereby publishing notice that the Election Commission office will be open for Early Voting by personal appearance from February 14 through February 27, 2024. Any registered voter may vote in person during this period. Early voting will occur at the Election Commission office located at 214 Broadway, Hartsville.

Early Voting Hours

8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays
8:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. Tuesdays
8:30 a.m. –12:00 Noon Saturdays

The office will be closed on February 19, 2024, for the county and state holiday. Voters who have moved within Trousdale County may change their address during Early Voting or by mail no later than February 27, 2024. **VOTERS WHO FAIL TO CHANGE THEIR ADDRESS PRIOR TO ELECTION DAY MAY EXPERIENCE A DELAY IN VOTING.**

Absentee Voting by Mail

You may also vote absentee by mail if you will be unable to go to your polling place in Trousdale County during the early voting period and on Election Day (for a reason other than imprisonment) and/or you have one of the following situations. Specific reasons include: Individuals who are full-time residents of a licensed nursing home, home for the aged or similar licensed institute; Individuals with a CDL; Military service members and military spouses; Students, or spouse of such student, in an accredited post secondary institution of learning in this state which is outside of Trousdale County; Individuals who are hospitalized or medically unable to appear at the polling place or the Election Office for this election; Individuals who are the caretaker of a hospitalized, ill or disabled person; Individuals who have a disability and your polling place is not accessible; Individuals who are unable to appear during the early voting period or at the polling place on Election Day because you are serving as a juror for the federal or state court; Individuals who are 60 years of age or older; Candidates for office in the election in which you wish to vote; Individuals who are an election official, or a member or employee of the election commission on Election Day; Individuals who are unable to appear during early voting period or at the polling place because of observance of a religious holiday.

If you meet one of the above conditions and wish to vote by mail, you must request an application for an absentee ballot in writing over your signature. The request can be made now through February 27, 2024. The request can serve as the application for ballot if it contains the following: The voter's name and signature; voter's address in the county; voter's social security number and birth date; the address to mail the ballot;

reason the voter is requesting to vote by mail; and the elections the voter wishes to vote in (including party preference for primary elections.) If the request does not contain all the information listed above, the election commission shall send the voter an application for an absentee ballot in order to obtain the needed information. Federal or Tennessee state government issued photo ID is required to vote, unless an exception applies. College student IDs will not be accepted.
