NOTICE OF EARLY VOTING AND ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL
STATE PRIMARY AND COUNTY GENERAL ELECTION AUGUST 6, 2026

The Trousdale County Election Commission is hereby publishing notice that the Election Commission office will be open for Early Voting by personal appearance from July 17, 2026, through August 1, 2026. Any registered voter may vote in person during this period. Early voting will occur at the Election Commission early voting site located at 200 East Main Street, Room 3, Hartsville.

Early Voting Hours

8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays
8:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. Tuesdays
8:30 a.m. – 12:00 Noon Saturdays

Voters who have moved within Trousdale County may change their address during Early Voting or by mail no later than August 1, 2026. VOTERS WHO FAIL TO CHANGE THEIR ADDRESS PRIOR TO ELECTION DAY MAY EXPERIENCE A DELAY IN VOTING.

Absentee Voting by Mail

You may also vote absentee by mail if you fall under one of the following categories: Individuals who are 60 years of age or older; Individuals who will be outside of their county during all hours of early voting and before the polls close on Election Day (for a reason other than imprisonment); Individuals who are hospitalized, ill or physically disabled and unable to appear at their polling place to vote; Individuals who are the caretaker of a hospitalized, ill or disabled person; Full-time students, or spouse of such student, in an accredited post-secondary institution of learning which is outside of Trousdale County; Individuals who are full-time residents of a licensed nursing home, home for the aged or similar licensed institute outside Trousdale County; Individuals on the permanent absentee list; Candidates for office in the election in which they wish to vote; Individuals who are unable to vote during the early voting period or on Election Day because of the observance of a religious holiday; Individuals who are an election official, or a member or employee of the election commission on Election Day; Individuals who are unable to appear during the early voting period or at the polling place on Election Day because they are serving as a juror for the federal or state court; Individuals who have a disability and their polling place is not accessible; Individuals with a CDL or TWIC or spouse of a person with a CDL or TWIC who will be out of the county during early voting and Election Day; Military service members, military spouses or military dependents; activated National Guard members on state orders; Overseas citizens who are otherwise qualified to vote in Tennessee. If you meet one of the above conditions and wish to vote by mail, you must request an application for an absentee ballot in writing over your signature, by phone or online. The request can be made now through July 27, 2026. The written request can serve as the application for ballot if it contains the following: The voter's name and signature; voter's address in the county; voter's social security number and birth date; the address to mail the ballot; reason the

voter is requesting to vote by mail; and the elections the voter wishes to vote in (including party preference for primary elections.) If the written request does not contain all the information listed above, the election commission shall send the voter an application for an absentee ballot in order to obtain the needed information. Federal or Tennessee state government issued photo ID is required to vote, unless an exception applies. College student IDs will not be accepted.
