### **History of GCFD**

Grove City Volunteer Fire Department was founded on September 21, 1904. It was then the borough supplied funding for the first equipment. A hose cart was one of the first pieces of equipment in the department. (One can still be seen on display in the department display room at 395 E. Pine St.)

The first piece of motorized equipment operated by GCFD was in 1916. (Our 1925 REO Speed wagon, one of the early pieces of apparatus can still be seen on display with the hose cart.)



The department currently operates at 395 E. Pine St. with Two Engines, a Tower Ladder, and a Utility pickup truck.
