Dear Ones of St. Matthew's,

As you receive this Newsletter, we will be approaching the Third Sunday in Lent, and as it is my practice to add a devotional study to my personal piety during the Lenten Season, I wanted to share with you the devotion from *Drawn to the Cross* that is assigned to 3 Lent. It is from Henri Nouwen, and I trust that it will touch you. The title is *Faithful Forever*.

Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go. ~ Joshua 1:9

"Please, Lord, keep calling me back to you, by day and by night, in joy and in sadness, during moments of success and moments of failure. Never let me leave you. I know you walk with me. Help me walk with you today, tomorrow and always." (Henri J.M. Nouwen, *Heart Speaks to Heart*, 29)

Our devotions this week focus on our Faithful Lord. Henri Nouwen's prayer is poignant for our Faithful Lord to keep us Faithful in our daily walk with Him. And God does! In times of spiritual stumbling, Jesus calls us to repentance, assuring us of God's unlimited forgiveness. In moments of weakness and failure, God empowers us to be strong and courageous. In times of success and egotism, God calls us to humble ourselves and give God glory. And if we are tempted to leave God and stray from God's Word and Worship, God calls us back to God's self with a heart of love that is longing to welcome us home.

But that's not all. When we are overwhelmed by loneliness and despair, our Lord is always there to uplift us and sustain us, until the dark clouds pass by. And if we are ever frightened or dismayed by what the future may bring, be assured that the One Who is "the same yesterday and today and forever" will "never leave you or forsake you." (Hebrews 13:8, 5)

Faithful Lord, I thank You for Your sure promise that You will be with me wherever I go. Keep me faithful to You, no matter what may come my way. Amen

Thank you to all that participated in our Fundraiser/ bunco game night last month. All funds collected benefited the "Lift Up the vulnerable".



# Musical Musings by Tom Killian

I have a question for you: What happens inside our brain when we sing a hymn?

First let's look at some more basic questions:

Why do advertisers pay big bucks to have often idiotic advertising claims set to music?

How is it possible that some victims of dementia can sing but cannot talk? And what on earth does all this have anything to do with church music?

Most of us flatter ourselves that we are pretty much immune to advertising claims. Even the most credulous of us have built-in censors which keep us from automatically believing every word blaring from radio or TV. Let's test this assumption. Try saying out loud some phrase from a current musical commercial jingle. Your built-in censor warns you not to believe what you just heard. The problem is, you had to actually speak the words – divorce the words from the music, at least in your head - for your censor to kick in. You may not have consciously believed the words when you heard this jingle, but you didn't discard them out of hand, either. Those words are still kicking around in your brain somewhere. The advertiser is counting on it. They know from experience that those words kicking around in enough brains are going to improve their bottom line.

It appears that the brain centers which are active in processing speech are different from those that process music, even when that music includes words. So sometimes a person whose dementia prevents them from talking can still sing. As we see from the above example with the advertising jingle, this difference appears to apply to the listener as well as the singer.

Music is an excellent tool for brain-washing. You see this especially in stirring up patriotic fervor by authoritarian governments. The words sneak in under the radar. The words of our hymns have been carefully edited by the Church Publishing editors to allow us to take them into our hearts without having to examine the truth of each verse. The hymns help us give voice to our faith, our hopes and our beliefs. Often the words will come back to us years later, to strengthen, inspire or console us.
