Dear Ones of St. Matthew's,

It is raining today as I address the parish ... a lot. I am thankful for the rain. After all, April Showers bring May flowers, as they say. As I was driving to the church, I became spiritually aware of the rain, particularly of water ... Not just because the streets were flooded or because my windshield wipers were on there highest setting, but rather in a sacramental way. Allow me to quote from our Rite of Baptism liturgy.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the Children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the Land of Promise. In it Your Son Jesus received the Baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through His death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in His death. By it we share in His resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into His fellowship those who come to Him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Life Giving, Joy restoring, Grace instilling water!

Dear Ones, we will enter into the final season of the Christian calendar, soon. It happens to be the longest as well (as long as all the other seasons combined). "I NOW PRONOUNCE YOU...": [Note: Parts of the following appeared in a previous newsletter article some years ago; but they apply here as well.] My wife Dianne is an ardent fan of the PBS television program Antiques Roadshow. Once, as I passed through the family room where she was watching an episode of the show, I heard the reviewer declare an item of furniture to be a "married piece." Trying not to get distracted by visions of a tall and stately secretary, standing nervously beside a china cabinet bedecked in white lace and orange blossoms, I learned that a married item is something created by joining part of one piece of existing furniture to another part of a second piece. The resulting creation may

be dismissed by purists as inferior to (and of less value than) either of the original items. Still, it does have a new lease on life, and meets a need of its fabricator. Well, thanks to the availability of works in the *public domain*, we can accomplish similar results by "marrying" two hymns!

Music, lyrics, texts, poems and other published items are most often placed in the public domain either because their original copyrights have expired, or because their authors / composers opted to make these works publicly available rather than protecting them by copyright. Without going into a lot of legalese, suffice it to say that public-domain works may be freely used and distributed, with no worries about violating someone's intellectual property rights. I recently tried my hand at this by combining the public-domain music from one hymn with public-domain lyrics from another hymn, to obtain a new Easter hymn titled "He, Who On the Cross a Victim." The music is based on a traditional Swedish folksong, which was never copyrighted; and the lyrics, whose original copyright has expired, were extracted from a hymn in our own 1982 Hymnal. The new hymn has been placed in the public domain, so that we can print it in our bulletin for use in a worship service in early May; and other churches can use it as well, if desired.

I hope some of you will recognize the music, which is often heard with a different hymn text (which is copyright-protected). And for bonus points, see if you can identify the hymn in our 1982 Hymnal from which this public-domain hymn text is taken. [Hint: the original hymn is *not* named "He, Who On the Cross a Victim."]
