History

The Episcopal presence in Madison began in the mid-1980s with the Church of Our Savior. In 1991, Rev. Michael Cleckler led the establishment of St. Matthew's Episcopal Church. A generous volunteer effort helped transform a warehouse into our first sanctuary. From our beginning, the parish featured strong lay leadership, meaningful formation programs, and an authentically welcoming energy.

We broke ground on our first dedicated sanctuary, followed by its inaugural worship service in the summer of 1998. The parish witnessed its greatest period of physical expansion and growth in infrastructure, under the leadership of the Rev. Steve Gruman. We added modular classrooms and enhanced Christian education programs. We built a new and expanded sanctuary and repurposed the original into a meeting hall.

We completed the Christian Ed Building in 2016. This marked an important milestone and expanded our capacity for ministries, gatherings, and outreach.

During Chris Hartley's tenure, St. Matthew's established our Endowment Fund. This further strengthens our long-term stability and demonstrates our commitment to growth and stewardship. Recent seasons reflected the broader realities of the Episcopal Church. They brought blessings and challenges amid shifting perspectives and evolving expectations of church life. We navigated a season marked by change and challenge, impacting our sense of shared direction. We are blessed with our current interim leadership. They are beacons lighting our path as we regain our footing and refocus on Christ's call to unity.

Our Children and Youth

St. Matthew's loves the exuberance, honesty, and joy that children and youth bring to our parish family. Their presence is integral to our life together, a defining element of our identity. We encourage children and youth ages eight and up to participate in the liturgy by serving as acolytes and joining age-appropriate ministries. From the weekly children's homily—an element we hope to reinstate soon—to the family-focused Christmas Eve service, we place children at the front and center of our services.

We have a dedicated group of staff members and a team of volunteers, all trained in the Diocesan youth protection policies. Through the efforts of this incredible team,

children remain squarely at the heart of our parish life. Our youth produce an incredible impact within our community, enthusiastically manifesting our mission through their activities. They actively advance our commitment to cultivate love through authentic connection.

We continue to benefit from the 2016 renovations, which expanded our nursery and provided additional children's classrooms. We are eager to welcome more young families into our parish. Children and youth actively shape our present today, and they are the future of our thriving parish tomorrow.



Outreach

St. Matthew's outreach ministries, driven by the call to love God and love our neighbors, reach across every walk of life—locally, regionally, and globally. We support our unhoused neighbors through partnerships with First Stop and the Huntsville/North Alabama Continuum of Care. We provide food, resources, and care for individuals and families facing hardship through the Huntsville Assistance Program, the Food Bank of North Alabama, Enable Madison County, and Crisis Services. We care for young people and families through our commitment to children's programs at Friends of the 400, Sawyerville Summer Camp, and Madison Interfaith Council.

Beyond our local community, teams from St. Matthew's have served in Kenya, Belize, and Puerto Rico. We assist global ministries like Episcopal Relief & Development, Lift Up the Vulnerable, and the Ukrainian Fellowship of the Rolling Pin Craft and Bake sale. We have a parishioner serving as a missioner to Kenya. She started Lauren's Creative Corner, bringing art and therapy for children of the region. We share Christ's love with those affected by incarceration through Kairos Inside and Kairos Outside. In every outreach effort, St. Matthew's seeks to live out Christ's call to love our neighbors as ourselves—with open hands, generous hearts, and joyful spirits.

Ministries

Ministries and community life are the heartbeat of St. Matthew's, an extension of our commitment to loving our neighbors. Together, we build a congregation where all can grow in faith, find friendship, and deepen their sense of belonging.

Our ministries demonstrate the spirit of our church community: welcoming, cheerful, eager to serve, and grounded in the Gospel. They encompass the breadth of parish life, offering ways for everyone to serve and be served. These include:

Worship: Acolytes, Choir, Handbells, Lectors, Lay Eucharistic Ministers, Christian Formation, Women's Bible Study, Cursillo

Service and Care: Inreach, Outreach, Gratitude Team, Daughters of the King (DOK), Heart and Soil Gardening Ministry, Quilt Guild, Kenya Missioner

Fellowship: Hospitality, Greeters, Foyers Groups, Episcopal Church Women (ECW), Episcopal Youth Community (EYC), Men's Group

Our Community

Our church community life is vibrant and rich, filling our church year with warm traditions. We host events full of loving family fun, as well as intentional fellowship opportunities for adults. We celebrate our parish birthday, the Bishop's visit, and confirmations with our defining feast—the Annual Pig Roast. Every year, the organizers worry we won't have enough food or enough helpers. Without fail and right on time, the parish becomes a living "fishes and loaves." Tables fill, hands appear, and laughter carries. Here is the real character of St. Matthew's: casual, hopeful, and devoted.

All ages enjoy the fun, with kids tackling the water slide and adults enjoying music, dancing, and fellowship over a shared meal. We host a Rummage Sale, a Chili Cook off, Lessons and Carols, a Nativity Story, and a Mardi Gras celebration. At St. Matthew's, the rhythm of the year is enriched by beloved traditions we eagerly await. These gatherings strengthen our community, making us ready to welcome newcomers into a parish where faith and friendships thrive.





Worship

We are known for our warmth and hospitality, a spirit immediately felt on the steps of the church before service begins. Upon arriving at St. Matthew's on a Sunday morning, both newcomers and familiar faces are greeted by enthusiastic parishioners extending genuine welcome. We gather each Sunday at 10:00 a.m. for traditional Holy Eucharist with a full choir. Several times per year, the choir is accompanied by our handbell ensemble. We offer Sunday School for all ages at 9:00 a.m. A Wednesday noon Eucharist sustains the

middle of the week with prayer and fellowship. We look forward to reinstating our two-service Sunday schedule (8:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.).

We anchor our music in the 1982 Hymnal. We draw from the Alleluia III songbook and other service music. We love celebrating the traditional liturgy and rejoice in worship across generations. The children's sermon is a treasured moment in our liturgy, drawing smiles throughout the nave.

Our Desires For A New Rector

They must excel at providing pastoral care across multiple generations, especially to our youth. We seek someone who forges meaningful connections across diverse groups and will actively welcome new families with children, sustaining St. Matthew's long and productive future. Ultimately, we pray for a rector who will lead this parish with the same love we have for it. They will share in our joys, walk beside us in faith, and help us grow in Christ's service.

Madison, Alabama


