In the Gospel of John's discourse of the Last Supper, Jesus offers comfort to His disciples before his passion (betrayal, trial, crucifixion, burial, and resurrection {14:27}). John's account is the most detailed of that evening's events and great insight into Jesus's thoughts is given. The next few days' events would be frightening and anxiety generating for His followers. They would scatter into hiding and fear the worst of outcomes for anyone who believed in Christ. Jesus would have known what was forthcoming, and He hoped to quell their emotions. Little did they know that their lives were going to be chaotically disrupted only in a few short hours. Jesus would have been afraid, as well, as his prayers in the garden of Gethsemane would reflect. Yet, He worried first about their fate, not His. They were His sheep. He was their Shepherd. They were entering into a very difficult time. They needed peace.

Have you ever felt that way? You know, afraid and confused! Something detrimental has happened, and you are scared, disoriented, and alone. Your world has been shaken, and you need peace. Peace is such a grace. It is what we all ultimately long to have when our head hits the pillow at night, and you are without it.

Then Jesus says, "Peace."

Dear Ones, when those times come (and they will), we can turn to Him looking for peace, and it will be granted ... to everyone ... all of us.

Church tower, roof, and lightning rod repaired. That was a big job requiring two lifts (inside and out) to bring the workers up to the tip top of our tower building roof. While there have been maintenance type repairs done over the years, water coming into the building was the final straw. So, while it was expensive, it was absolutely necessary.

Jr. Warden, Ed Snell, has been busy all around the church doing a variety of small repairs. We are so thankful for Ed and his talents. Ed will be displaying his handiwork from time to time in the Narthex

- His team of volunteer workers have been a blessing, both for repair assistance and work on the grounds. A special thanks to Melissa Barton, Miranda Cassell, and special friends, for their work on the gardens and landscaping around the church. Your green thumbs are producing beautiful results.
- The inground sprinkler system is next up for repair. This too has suffered from time, weather and an occasional lawn mower strike. So, if the grounds are looking a little parched, stay tuned, our inground system should be up and going very soon.
- Housekeeping- After the retirement of Fran, we moved our cleaning service to Vangard, who will clean every Friday. With the help of the selection committee: Ed, Margaret Ott and Miranda Cassell, we were able to replace our former cleaners UNDER BUDGET!
- Prayer Garden-if you have not been to see this area, please visit the prayer garden. I cannot wait to see how beautiful that area will be in the Spring when the tulips planted beside the cross are in bloom. The cross in the garden is now illuminated due to the solar powered lights that have been installed?

Amy West House - Our dear youth center is back up and operational. This building was closed for a while last year due to water intrusion problems. Another episode of time, water, and wind driven rain. Our deepest thanks to Jann Eich and her youth students for their patience.

We will soon have a Church Directory, thanks to Jimmy Hubbard and Diane Loehr, who chaired the project which will include both a paper directory and an app. Jann Eich, Terry Sampson, Margaret Ott, Barbara Combs, and I also worked at the sign-up desks to help kick off this project.

And, last, but most important, we are about to begin a maintenance program for our HVAC units. This was a very, very difficult decision for your Vestry. Please rest easy as we do have reserves that can be used to manage this repair. Please note that in an effort to better manage the temps, we have placed Lucite lock boxes over several of the thermostats. If you have a need to access one of these thermostats, please seek out me, Ed Snell, or the on-duty VOD to assist you. It will be our pleasure to help.

In closing, please know that we carefully watch the budget, seek counsel with our Treasurer and our clergy, Father Chris, Father Dillon, and Deacon Lynn as we work through our Vestry meetings. We do what we do for the love our church. Again, from your Vestry, thank you for the opportunity to serve you and our church. It is a very important service that we take very seriously as we pray before and after each Vestry meeting seeking God's guidance on what we do. 
