CHARACTER COUNTS

In a chapter called, "Taking the Long View" Gregory Jones states, character can only be formed over time. Character identifies that which we most value in life, and reflects the long-term formation of our emotional, moral and intellectual life. As Aristotle rightly insisted, character is formed through shaping habits of life through disciplined practice and the cultivation of morally significant friendships.

We in the Church are in the habit of taking the long view. Our story is an old and venerated one which bears truth. God created all that is and handed it over to the most promising of all God's creatures- human beings. It was given freely in love for the purpose of joy. We chose in return to be not givers but takers. We even took the life of God's Son. We were given the freedom to do just that!

But the only true freedom comes with giving, not taking. Over time we must develop habits of grace and generosity. We do this through giving our time, talent and treasure in service of God in a community of friendship called the Church. The ability of the Church to take a long view requires the renewal of that commitment each and every year at this time. Every ministry, each program, the overall mission of St. Matthew's Church depends entirely on the habit of grace and generosity of this community. No one is exempt from the decision to choose "what we value most and how our character will be formed." God will stir up God's people, God has given the example, but YOU decide.

God of blessing and abundance, you have given us <u>all</u> that we have.

Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother, To Philemon our dear friend and co-worker, to Apphia our sister, to Archippus our fellow soldier, and to the church in your house: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. When I remember you in my prayers, I always thank my God because I hear of your love for all the saints and your faith toward the Lord Jesus. I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective when you perceive all the good that we may do for Christ. I have indeed received much joy and encouragement from your love, because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you, my brother. For this reason, though I am bold enough in Christ to command you to do your duty, yet I would rather appeal to you on the basis of love-- and I, Paul, do this as an old man, and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. Formerly he was useless to you, but now he is indeed useful both to you and to me. I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the gospel; but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a beloved brother-- especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord. So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me. If he has wronged you in any way, or owes you anything, charge that to my account. I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand: I will repay it. I say nothing about your owing me even your

own self. Yes, brother, let me have this benefit from you in the Lord! Refresh my heart in Christ. Confident of your obedience, I am writing to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say.
