
Public Safety Risk! 3 Years of PRIDE School Walk Outs



A quick web search reflects the distraction and controversy that PRIDE month in US public schools creates, as students across the country walk out to demonstrate.

Canada's "Pride" Walk-Out Day is from Friday, May 30, to Monday, June 2, 2025. In it's 3rd year, the grassroots response by worried parents all across Canada, show their disapproval of unchecked gender ideology indoctrination in schools. The student walk out is also in protest of the increasing proliferation of sexually explicit material in school libraries and as "teacher resources" inside classrooms.

"The protest involves keeping children home on the first days of Pride Month (when the PRIDE flag is raised at school campuses) to send a message to school officials and trustees. The inaugural 2023 walk-out saw unexpectedly high participation, with absence rates ranging from 30% to 75% in various regions."

In 2024, the momentum continued, and the campaign led to real policy discussions. The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board passed a ban on the Pride flag, while similar motions were considered in York Region and Waterloo Region.

The walk-out is a growing movement of parents taking a stand against radical sexual programming and an unacceptable level of political activism in schools. Organizers hope the 2025 event will further that message and continue to pressure educational institutions to reconsider their approach.1

Dear [school administrator],

As social separation persists in the streets and campuses of our country. I wanted to make a short appeal to the [school board] to take the leadership role in efforts to reunify our nation, beginning here in our county.

With the growing number of sociopolitical special interest groups looking to promote their causes, the potential for social tensions, including in the public school system, is only increasing. Instead of simplifying the atmosphere in our public institutions, and maintaining a focus on patriotism and good values for our country, it creates a change in focus on a clearly controversial topic for many Americans.

This fact is creating distraction from learning in environments which should be peaceful and conducive. The recent trend of flying special interest group flags on public and school property must end. Let's keep the focus on love of our country which all Americans should have in common and educating our youth in academics subjects only.

Flying a PRIDE flag or having PRIDE related material in the halls and classrooms risks dividing communities. It also violates the principle of political neutrality, a cornerstone of our public institutions, including the school system.

I would encourage the board to begin the practice of flying only the unifying American and state flags on [school board] property.
