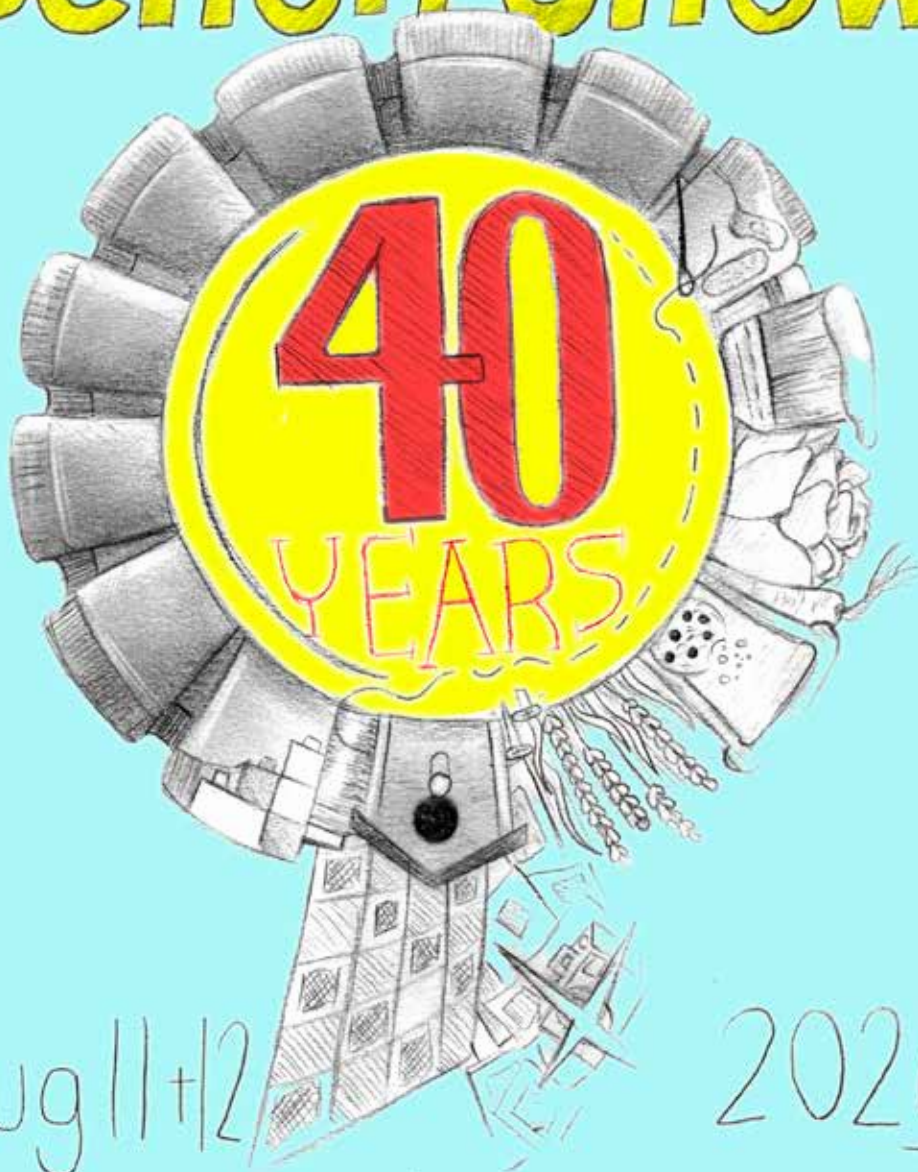

- *Be sure you have entered the proper item in the proper class.*
- *Be sure you have prepared the correct number of items to be judged in each class.*
- ***Be Open Minded*** - *you can't always win but great satisfaction can be derived from showing your work.*
- *If you had a good time, consider volunteering to assist at next year's fair.*

General Rules

1. Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
 2. Exhibitors may enter as many classes as they wish, but each exhibitor may enter only one item per class.
 3. Exhibits previously entered in the Round Hill Bench Show will not be accepted.

 8. Horticulture and Field Crop exhibits are to be taken to the Community Centre on: **Tuesday, August 11, 2026**, between 9:00 and 11:00 a.m.
- DOORS WILL BE CLOSED AT 11:00 A.M. SHARP!**
9. **NO PERSON WHO HAS AN EXHIBIT IN THE SHOW WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE BUILDING DURING JUDGING, EXCEPT THOSE PERSONS INVOLVED IN HANDLING AND SETTING UP THE DISPLAYS.**
 10. Exhibits will be open for public viewing from: 4:00 to 9:00 p.m. on **Tuesday, August 11, 2026**; and 3:00 to 7:00 p.m. on **Wednesday, August 12, 2026**.
 11. Prizes and awards will be presented at 7:00 p.m. on **Wednesday, August 12, 2026**.
 12. Judges' decision will be final. (Judging standards apply.)
 13. In the case of a tie in the Aggregate prize awards, the person with the most first place ribbons shall receive the award.

Horticulture

SECTION 1 - FIELD CROPS

Committee Chairperson: Dana Bawden, 780-672-3465

RULES

1. **ALL ENTRIES MUST BE GROWN IN 2026** by the individual entering, except for threshed grains which must be from 2025.
2. Any active farmer of the same family may exhibit from the same farm, but not in the same classes except **class 127**, where they **must** be different crops.
3. All grains may be labelled as to variety grown from.
4. Grain sheaves should be tied 3 times and be at least 1" wide at the centre band; not to exceed 30" in length.
5. Grain sheaves should be stripped of leaves; forage sheaves should not be stripped.
6. Forage sheaves should be a minimum 15" in length and 4" in width; canola seed sheaves should not exceed 40" in length and tied with 3 bands.

SECTION 2 - VEGETABLES

RULES

1. Exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and have been in his/her possession for the previous two months.
2. **ANY ONE OR MORE MEMBERS OF THE SAME FAMILY MAY EXHIBIT FROM THE SAME FAMILY GARDEN, BUT NOT IN THE SAME CLASS, except classes 236, 237, 238, 239, 240 and 245;** entries from the same family must be of **DIFFERENT KINDS**.
3. Display vegetables and fruit on a **SUITABLE SIZE PLATE OR TRAY**. (eg. cucumbers on an OB-LONG tray, peas or berries on a SMALL PLATE) - **NAME VARIETIES**.
4. The management reserves the right to remove from the building any exhibit found to be infected with insects or disease.
5. Judged by A.H.A. certified judges.
